Temporary Accommodation Units (TAUs)



Factsheet | Modules available for the Kimberley



The State Government has supported Fitzroy Crossing to recover after the 2023 floods, including through funding repairs and rebuilds and providing affected residents with temporary places to stay on country, while their homes were repaired, called Temporary Accommodation Units (TAUs).

As people move out and back into their repaired or rebuilt homes, the TAUs are being disconnected from water and power and locked up for health and safety reasons. They will then be moved off country to secure storage as we can't keep them on the emergency housing land as it is not owned by us.

20 new homes will soon be constructed in the Fitzroy Valley to help local families utilising some key structural components from the repurposed temporary accommodation modules.

A culturally informed, Registration of Interest process is underway for local businesses and residents who may be interested in the remaining modules for use as temporary accommodation and office purposes as they are unable to be converted into permanent housing.

The components which will be available include amenities modules with a kitchen, dining room and laundry but no bathroom, decking/verandah modules and self-contained modules with two to three bedrooms and a bathroom.

The ROI process will support the valuable work of organisations and agencies in the Fitzroy Valley and the wider Kimberley region. Local residents, businesses, community organisations and government agencies are invited to register their interest in the vacated modules.

Anyone interested in the modules will need to be able to transfer them from their current location (within the Fitzroy Valley) and install at their intended location within the Kimberley at their own cost, and will also be required to pay for ongoing costs associated with their upkeep.
