



Advertising requirements

for Short-Term Rental Accommodation (STRA) Register

What you need to know

Short-Term Rental Accommodation (STRA) advertising requirements are in effect for accommodation providers, booking platforms, and advertising publications that promote STRA premises.

For accommodation providers:

Ensure your STRA premises is registered before advertising or accepting bookings. The premises' STRA registration number must be conspicuously displayed (readily visible) in all advertisements.

For booking platforms:

Verify that any STRA listing on your platform is compliant. Publishing a prohibited advertisement or listing is an offence.

For advertising publications:

Ensure any advertisement or promotion of a STRA premises is compliant before publishing. Publishing a prohibited advertisement is an offence.

What constitutes a prohibited advertisement?

A prohibited advertisement for short-term rental accommodation is one that:

- relates to a residential premises that is not registered;
- does not conspicuously display the registration number for the premises; and/or
- contains a false registration number for the premises.

Penalties apply for prohibited advertisements.

What are some examples of advertisements?

An advertisement may be a listing on a booking platform, a print advertisement (e.g. newspaper, magazine, flyer), or an advertisement online, including promotion on a website, blog or social media post. These are just some examples, and the list is not exhaustive.
