Cigarette butts can cause fires

Please dispose of your cigarette butt responsibly

Flicking your cigarette butt from a vehicle can result in a \$200 fine. Lit cigarette butts can result in a fine of \$500.



Reporting litterers

Litter is any material that is disposed of on the ground incorrectly. It includes cigarette butts, drink containers, food and food packaging thrown from a car window or items fallen from an unsecured load. Any litter disposed of inappropriately is illegal under the *Litter Act 1979*.

You can help to reduce litter by becoming a Keep Australia Beautiful Council registered Litter Reporter and reporting offences to Keep Australia Beautiful Council. To register visit www.kabc.wa.gov.au.

- go 100m from any waterway, camp site or roadside rest stop
- **go** dig a hole at least 15cm deep and bury all waste and paper
- go with a bag for sanitary items (as they don't break down easily)
- go to http://www.dumppoints.com to find a place for your caravan to go too

Stop roadside littering

Roadsides are the most littered areas in Western Australia. Roadside litter has to stop and you can help.

What can you do?

- Rin it!
- No bin? Take your rubbish with you until you find one, then bin it!

Why is it a problem?

- Discarded cigarette butts are a major fire hazard
- Cleaning up litter in Western Australia costs more than \$6 million a year
