

## Training Accreditation Council Chairperson Selection Criteria

---

Expressions of interest are invited from suitably qualified and experienced persons, who meet the following selection criteria:

1. Experience in vocational education and training (VET) and/or understanding of the role and structure of the VET system.
2. Expertise, qualifications or experience relevant to the functions of the Training Accreditation Council (TAC) as prescribed by the Vocational Education and Training Act 1996 and its subsidiary legislation.

This could include expertise in activities such as registration, accreditation, market monitoring, compliance, a broader regulatory strategy, and education. Please include any specific experience related to the VET context.

3. Demonstrated knowledge and understanding of quality assurance (preferably in the VET sector) and experience and use in interpreting and applying policy and processes.
4. Board/committee experience with a demonstrated understanding of good governance practice (including an awareness of the accountabilities of boards/committees acting in the public interest), risk management, strategic policy development and implementation.
5. Ability to:
  - i. Lead and facilitate meetings;
  - ii. communicate, debate and actively participate in meetings;
  - iii. exercise independent judgement;
  - iv. develop and maintain effective working relationships; and
  - v. network with stakeholders, industry and the community.

6. Council members play an important role in the regulation of the VET sector in Western Australia and the following information is requested to assist with the selection process and due diligence checks:
  - i. Do you have any actual, potential or perceived conflicts of interests if appointed as a member of the TAC ? if yes please provide details
  - ii. Are you an undischarged bankrupt or your property is subject to an arrangement under the laws relating to bankruptcy ? if yes please provide details
  - iii. have you been convicted of an indictable offence ? if yes please provide detail.
