西澳政府正在密切监测所有州和地区的新冠病毒（COVID-19）疫情，根据最新的公共卫生建议，制定了安全合理的州际边界控制措施。

更新后的全国健康状况标准允许有条件地安全跨州进入西澳大利亚州。

对偏远的原住民社区实行的限制和修改后的2平方米空间规则将继续保留。

如果疫情爆发，各州和地区的风险状况可能会迅速改变，进入西澳大利亚州的旅行将适用更严格的规定。

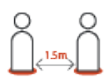
为了保证所有西澳大利亚州居民和游客的安全，西澳大利亚州将澳大利亚境内的其他州和领地归类为：

The WA Government is closely monitoring the COVID-19 situation across all states and territories and a safe and sensible controlled interstate border is in place based on the latest public health advice.

The updated nationwide health-based threshold that allows for safe travel into Western Australia from interstate is subject to conditions.

Remote Aboriginal community restrictions and the modified 2 square metre rule will remain in place.

The risk status for states and territories can change very quickly if there is an outbreak and much stricter rules for travel into Western Australia will apply.

In order to keep all Western Australia's and visitors safe, WA categorises other states and territories within Australia as:

- very low risk
- low risk
- medium risk
- high risk
