

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT ACT 2005 (WA)

Sections 61, 67, 71 and 72A

OUTBREAK RESTRICTIONS (TRANSITIONAL) DIRECTIONS (NO 2)

The World Health Organization declared COVID-19 a pandemic on 11 March 2020.

On 15 March 2020, the Minister for Emergency Services declared a state of emergency with effect from 12 am on 16 March 2020 in respect of the pandemic caused by COVID-19 pursuant to section 56 of the *Emergency Management Act 2005 (WA)* (**Act**) (**State of Emergency**). The State of Emergency applies to the State of Western Australia.

I, Christopher John Dawson, Commissioner of Police and State Emergency Coordinator, give certain of these directions (relating to the closure of certain places) pursuant to my powers as a police officer under section 71 of the Act and consider it reasonably necessary to give other directions to prevent, control or abate the risks associated with the emergency presented by the pandemic caused by COVID-19 pursuant to my powers under sections 61, 67 and 72A of the Act.

PREAMBLE

1. The purpose of these directions is to regulate certain gatherings, to place restrictions on certain places and to facilitate a continued safe transition to a COVID safe re-opening of places and activities for the Western Australian community following the circuit-break lockdown measures that were introduced on 29 June 2021 and the interim measures that were implemented on 3 July 2021 so as to limit the spread of COVID-19.

CITATION

2. These directions may be referred to as the **Outbreak Restrictions (Transitional) Directions (No 2)**.

COMMENCEMENT

3. These directions come into effect upon signing.

REVOCATION

4. The Outbreak Restrictions (Transitional) Directions (**revoked directions**) are revoked from the time these directions come into effect.

5. Despite paragraph 4, a person must continue to comply with any requirement which still applied to the person under the revoked directions immediately before these directions came into effect, to the same extent that the person would have to comply with them if the revoked directions had not been revoked, and, for the avoidance of doubt, if a person fails to comply with a requirement that applied to them under the revoked directions, the person may commit an offence under the Act.

OPERATION

6. Unless specified otherwise in these directions, these directions apply in the **affected area** only.
7. These directions are intended to apply despite the COVID Safe (Phase 5) Directions, and to the extent of any inconsistency, these directions prevail.

INTERPRETATION

8. Unless specified otherwise, any reference in these directions to any other **direction** made by the State Emergency Coordinator is deemed to be a reference to that direction as amended or replaced from time to time.

DIRECTIONS

Prohibited gatherings

9. A person who owns, controls or operates **premises** in the affected area must not allow a **prohibited gathering** to occur on the premises.
10. A person must not hold, conduct or participate in a prohibited gathering on premises in the affected area.
11. A person must not attend a prohibited gathering on premises in the affected area.

Additional requirements for certain gatherings

12. In addition to any other requirement imposed by these directions, a person must not hold, conduct, participate in, or attend in the affected area:
 - (a) a gathering of persons at a **home**, other than a gathering:
 - (i) of a kind referred to in subparagraph (c) or (d); or
 - (ii) where everyone in the gathering is a member of the same **household**; or

- (iii) where the total number of persons present does not exceed 30 persons (including members of the household); or
- (b) a **private gathering** of more than 150 persons that occurs at an **outdoor space** unless the gathering is for a **community sporting event** (in which case the requirements set out in paragraphs 15, 16 and 17 apply); or
- (c) a wedding or a wedding reception, other than to the extent that, excluding the celebrant and **staff**, it involves no more than 150 persons; or
- (d) a funeral or a wake, other than to the extent that, excluding staff and those persons whose presence is necessary to conduct the funeral or the wake, it involves no more than 150 persons.

*Note: In addition to the above capacity limits, the gatherings referred to in paragraph 12 are also subject to the 2 square metre rule. For example, an indoor gathering of 30 persons at a person's home could only proceed if the **indoor space** in question was at least 60 square metres in area.*

Restrictions on certain places

13. Every owner, occupier or person apparently in charge of an **affected place** may only allow a gathering:
 - (a) of up to 150 **patrons** at that place; and
 - (b) where there is at least 2 square metres of **publicly accessible space** for each patron at the place.
14. Every owner, occupier or person apparently in charge of a university or other **higher education facility** may only allow a gathering at that place provided that there is at least 2 square metres of publicly accessible space for each person at the gathering.

Special requirements applicable to community sport

15. In addition to any other requirements imposed by these directions, a person may only hold, conduct, attend or engage in a community sporting event that occurs in an indoor space in the affected area if there are no more than 150 patrons present in addition to any participants, coaches or officials.

16. A person may not hold, conduct, attend or engage in a community sporting event that occurs in an outdoor space in the affected area where there is not at least 2 square metres of publicly accessible space for each patron unless:
 - (a) the community sporting event is held at premises with **spectator seating**; and
 - (b) the community sporting event involves the use of that spectator seating in accordance with paragraph 17; and
 - (c) there is at least 2 square metres of publicly accessible space for each patron who is not accommodated in the spectator seating at the premises.
17. A person who owns, controls or operates premises in the affected area which is being used for a community sporting event must not utilise the spectator seating at the premises in a manner that results in the number of patrons in the spectator seating area exceeding 50% of the **fixed seating capacity** of the premises.

Special requirements applicable to events

18. A person must refrain from undertaking, engaging in, holding, conducting or attending an **event** in the affected area unless the requirements in paragraph 19(a) to (c) are complied with.
19. A person who owns, controls or operates premises in the affected area may allow the premises to be used for a **low capacity event** provided that:
 - (a) any requirements that are imposed in the COVID Safe (Phase 5) Directions on an event are complied with in respect of the low capacity event as if it were **Category 1 Event**; and
 - (b) no more than 150 patrons attend the low capacity event at the premises at any one time; and
 - (c) there is at least 2 square metres of publicly accessible space for each patron attending the low capacity event at the premises.

Special requirements applicable to gatherings at places with seated entertainment spaces

20. Notwithstanding paragraphs 9 to 14 of these directions, the owner, occupier or person apparently in charge of premises that is or includes a **seated entertainment space** may allow a gathering of more than 150 patrons in the seated entertainment space provided that:
- (a) the number of patrons does not exceed 50% of the fixed seating capacity of the seated entertainment space; and
 - (b) the gathering is not an event.

Special requirements applicable to major stadiums

21. A **stadium operator** must not allow a gathering of two or more patrons in a single undivided indoor space or a single undivided outdoor space at the relevant **major stadium** (including a **hospitality space** or a **special seating space**) where there is not at least 2 square metres of publicly accessible space for each patron, unless the gathering:
- (a) occurs as a result of persons transiting into, through or out of the relevant part of the relevant major stadium; or
 - (b) involves the use of the spectator seating in accordance with paragraph 22.
22. The stadium operator must not utilise the spectator seating at the relevant major stadium in a manner that results in the number of patrons in that area exceeding 50% of the fixed seating capacity.
23. The stadium operator may only allow a gathering of up to 150 patrons in any individual hospitality space or special seating space at the relevant major stadium.
24. Notwithstanding anything in these directions, the State Emergency Coordinator, or a person authorised by the State Emergency Coordinator for the purpose, may designate in writing any sporting or cultural event or undertaking to be held at a major stadium whilst these directions are in effect as only being allowed to proceed without any spectators and that designation must be complied with.

Face covering requirement

25. Subject to paragraph 26, a person in the affected area must wear a **face covering** at all times while they:
- (a) are in an indoor space; or
 - (b) are in an outdoor space, and it is not practicable to comply with **physical distancing protocols**; or
 - (c) are at or in a residential aged care facility, whether in an indoor space or outdoor space; or
 - (d) are on public transport.
26. A person is not required to wear a face covering where:
- (a) the person is within or at their home; or
 - (b) the person is attending a gathering of persons at a home, provided that the gathering is not prohibited by these directions; or
 - (c) the person is a child 12 years of age or under, unless the child is attending school in Year 7 and above; or
 - (d) the person is at the time attending school as a student in Year 6 or below; or
 - (e) the person has a physical, developmental or mental illness, injury, condition or disability which makes wearing a face covering unsuitable; or
 - (f) the person is communicating with a person who is deaf or hard of hearing and visibility of the mouth is essential for communication; or
 - (g) the nature of a person's occupation means that wearing a face covering is impractical to perform that occupation or creates a risk to their health and safety; or
 - (h) the person needs to temporarily remove their face covering so as to enable another person to appropriately perform their occupation; or
 - (i) the nature of a person's work or the activity that they are engaging in means that clear enunciation or visibility of the mouth is essential; or
 - (j) the person is consuming food, drink or medicine; or
 - (k) the person is asked to remove the face covering to ascertain identity; or

- (l) not wearing a face covering is required for emergency purposes (other than emergency preparation or emergency preparation activities, unless another exception specified in this paragraph applies); or
- (m) the person is working in the absence of others in an enclosed indoor space (unless and until another person enters that indoor space); or
- (n) the person is a resident in a residential aged care facility; or
- (o) the person is engaged in an activity involving swimming; or
- (p) the person is running or jogging or otherwise engaged in some form of strenuous or vigorous exercise or physical activity; or
- (q) the person is travelling in a **motor vehicle** and either is the sole occupant of that vehicle or is travelling in the vehicle with other persons provided that all the occupants of the vehicle are members of the same household; or
- (r) the person is undergoing medical, dental or beauty related care or treatment to the extent that such care or treatment requires that no face covering be worn; or
- (s) the person is directed by a judicial officer or tribunal member in proceedings in a court or tribunal to remove their face covering to ensure the proper conduct of those proceedings; or
- (t) the person is a prisoner or detainee in a prison, detention centre or other place of custody; or

Note: Nothing in these directions affects any other power a person may have to require a prisoner or detainee to wear a face covering.

- (u) not wearing a face covering is otherwise required or authorised by law; or
- (v) wearing a face covering is not safe in all the circumstances,

provided that, where a person is relying on an exemption under subparagraph (f) to (v), that person resumes wearing the face covering as soon as reasonably practicable after the person no longer falls within the relevant exemption.

Restrictions on travel by close and casual contacts

27. A person who:

- (a) has visited a **Tier 2 exposure site**, whether or not that location was a Tier 2 exposure site at the commencement of these directions or the Exposure Site (Western Australia) Directions; or
- (b) has received oral or written notice from a **responsible officer** that they are a **casual contact**;

must not travel from a **region** to another region unless:

- (c) at least 14 days have elapsed since the time that the person was at the Tier 2 exposure site; or
 - (d) that person has received approval in writing to leave the affected area from the Chief Health Officer or a person authorised by the Chief Health Officer for that purpose.
28. For the avoidance of doubt, a person who has visited a **Tier 1 exposure site** or has received oral or written notice that they are a **close contact** is required to comply with applicable provisions of the Exposure Site (Western Australia) Directions and the Quarantine and Isolation (Undiagnosed) Directions (No 2) and any directions given to them by a relevant officer under those directions and must not otherwise leave the affected area.

Requirements for persons who leave the affected area

29. A person who was in the affected area at any time after 12.00 pm on 27 June 2021 and travels or has travelled outside of the affected area must comply with paragraphs 25 and 26 of these directions.

AUTHORISATION

30. For the avoidance of doubt, in addition to and without limiting any other authorisation any **relevant officer** may have to do so, all relevant officers are authorised under section 61 of the Act to give any direction to a person for the purpose of giving effect to these directions.

DEFINITIONS

31. **Affected area** means:

- (a) the Metropolitan region described in Schedule 3 to the *Planning and Development Act 2005* (WA) (**Planning Act**);
- (b) the Peel Region described in item 6 of Schedule 4 to the Planning Act; and
- (c) Rottnest Island, as described in section 4 of the *Rottnest Island Authority Act 1987* (WA).

32. **Affected place** means:

- (a) a business characterised as a pub, bar or club (other than a **nightclub**) that supplies alcohol under a licence granted under the *Liquor Control Act 1988* (WA), but not including any part of the business constituted by a **bottleshop**; or
- (b) a nightclub; or
- (c) a hotel, whether licensed or unlicensed, but not any part of the hotel:
 - (i) constituted by a bottleshop; or
 - (ii) that is used to provide accommodation services; or
- (d) a restaurant or café (including premises selling food or drink in a food court); or
- (e) a gym, indoor sporting centre, wellness centre, health club or fitness centre (including a centre offering yoga, barre, pilates, aerobics, dancing or spin facilities) or boot camp; or
- (f) a **casino**; or
- (g) a cinema (including a drive-in cinema or outdoor cinema); or
- (h) a major stadium; or
- (i) an **entertainment venue of any other kind**; or
- (j) a gaming or gambling venue; or
- (k) adult entertainment premises (including but not limited to strip clubs, brothels and sex on premises venues); or

- (l) an amusement park or arcade (including, for the avoidance of doubt, a **wildlife park**); or
- (m) a **place of worship**, other than for the purposes of a wedding or funeral that is otherwise carried out in accordance with these directions; or
- (n) a beauty parlour, salon, hairdressers or barbershop; or
- (o) a nail salon; or
- (p) a tattoo parlour; or
- (q) a spa; or
- (r) a massage parlour; or
- (s) a sauna; or
- (t) a bathhouse; or
- (u) a play centre, whether indoors or outdoors; or
- (v) a community, recreation or youth centre or facility (including but not limited to community halls, clubs, Returned and Services League facilities and Police and Community Youth Centres); or
- (w) a swimming pool, whether indoor or outdoor (not including a community swimming pool which is run on a non-commercial basis or a swimming pool which forms part of the common property of shared residential premises such as an apartment complex); or
- (x) a gallery; or
- (y) a museum; or
- (z) an historic site; or
- (aa) a library; or
- (bb) a local government facility which is not essential to the continued functioning of the local government (such as, but in addition to, libraries and swimming pools); or
- (cc) a **playground**; or
- (dd) a **skate park**; or

- (ee) an **outdoor gym**; or
 - (ff) Perth Zoo.
33. **Authorised officer** has the same meaning that it has in the Act.
- Note: At the time of making these directions, all **police officers** are **authorised officers**, and paragraph 30 ensures that relevant officers are also authorised officers for the purposes of these directions.*
34. **Bottleshop** means an area physically attached or adjacent to the premises of a business characterised as:
- (a) a pub, bar or club that supplies alcohol under a licence granted under the *Liquor Control Act 1988* (WA); or
 - (b) a hotel,
- that is for the sale of packaged alcohol to be consumed off the premises of the pub, bar, club or hotel.
35. **Casino** has the same meaning that it has in the *Casino Control Act 1984* (WA).
36. **Casual contact** means a person who has had "casual contact" (as that term is used in the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) CDNA National Guidelines for Public Health Units from time to time) with a confirmed COVID-19 case.
37. **Category 1 Event** has the same meaning that it has in the COVID Safe (Phase 5) Directions.
38. **Close contact** has the same meaning that it has in the Controlled Border for Western Australia Directions.
39. **Community sporting event** means:
- (a) an organised and scheduled sporting event; or
 - (b) an organised and scheduled training session relating to an organised and scheduled sporting event,
- involving members of the community.
40. **Direction** includes a quarantine direction and any other direction under the Act or the *Public Health Act 2016* (WA), whether the direction is given orally or in writing.
41. **Emergency officer** has the same meaning that it has in the *Public Health Act 2016* (WA).

42. **Entertainment venue of any other kind** means any entertainment venue except a casino, cinema or nightclub.
43. **Event** has the same meaning that it has in the COVID Safe (Phase 5) Directions.
44. **Exempt gathering** means a gathering:
- (a) at an airport that is necessary for the normal business of the airport; or
 - (b) for the purposes of or related to public transportation, including at public transportation facilities such as stations, platforms and stops; or
 - (c) at a medical or health service facility that is necessary for the normal business of the facility; or
 - (d) at a disability or aged care facility; or
 - (e) for the purposes of providing care or assistance (including personal care) to a vulnerable person or providing emergency assistance; or
 - (f) for the purposes of emergency services; or
 - (g) at a prison, detention centre, lock up or other place of custody for the purposes of or related to the operation of that place of custody; or
 - (h) at Parliament for the purposes of its normal operations; or
 - (i) at a court or tribunal; or
 - (j) at a food market, supermarket, grocery store, retail store or shopping centre that is necessary for the normal business of those premises; or
 - (k) at an office building, factory, mining site (including mining site accommodation), construction site or other place of work that is necessary for the normal business of those premises, except at a university or higher education facility other than to the extent described in paragraph (m); or
 - (l) at a school, early childhood education facility or childcare centre that is necessary for the normal business of the school, facility or centre; or
 - (m) at a student accommodation facility (such as a boarding house) at a university or other higher education facility; or
 - (n) at a hotel, motel or other accommodation facility that is necessary for the normal operation of accommodation services; or

- (o) in an outdoor space where a gathering of persons which would otherwise constitute a prohibited gathering may be present for the purpose of transiting through the space; or

Example: Forrest Place, Perth.

- (p) in an indoor space where a gathering of persons which would otherwise constitute a prohibited gathering may be present for the purpose of transiting through the space; or

Examples: Perth Busport; an elevator or lift.

- (q) in an indoor space or an outdoor space where everyone in the gathering is a member of the same household; or

- (r) in or on a vehicle (including a motor vehicle, boat or aircraft), unless the vehicle is being used for the dominant purpose of serving or consuming food or drink; or

- (s) specified in writing as exempt from this direction by me (whether conditionally or unconditionally), or someone authorised for that purpose by me, as the State Emergency Coordinator, provided that any conditions to which the exemption is subject are complied with.

- 45. **Face covering** means a disposable surgical mask or fitted cloth mask that covers the nose and mouth (but does not include a face shield).
- 46. **Fixed seating** means seats which are securely affixed to the floor or otherwise fastened together in blocks of not less than 4 seats.
- 47. **Fixed seating capacity** means the maximum number of patrons who can be seated in **fixed seating** in the spectator seating.
- 48. **Formal worship** means a religious ceremony or service that consists of communal involvement or participation in religious observances or practices, including rites, rituals, prayer, singing or the receiving of religious instruction.
- 49. **Higher education facility** includes a vocational education facility or technical college.
- 50. **Home** means the premises or place where a person usually resides or other premises (such as a hotel or short stay accommodation) at which a person is able to reside.

51. **Hospitality space** means a space at the relevant major stadium which is:
- (a) characterised as a pub, bar or club (but not a nightclub) that supplies alcohol under a licence granted under the *Liquor Control Act 1988* (WA); or
 - (b) a restaurant or café (including premises selling food or drink in a food court).
52. **Household** means two or more persons who usually reside at the same home, irrespective of whether those persons are related to each other.
53. **Indoor space** means an area, room or premises that is or are substantially enclosed by a roof and a **sufficient dividing structure**, regardless of whether the roof or sufficient dividing structure, or any part of them, are permanent or temporary or capable of being opened or closed.
54. **Low capacity event** means any gathering of up to 150 patrons, whether in public or in private, and whether undertaken or engaged in on a for profit or not-for-profit basis.
55. **Major stadium** means, as context demands:
- (a) Optus Stadium; or
 - (b) HBF Park; or
 - (c) HBF Stadium – Main Arena; or
 - (d) RAC Arena.
56. **Motor vehicle** has the same meaning that it has in paragraph (b) of the definition of "motor vehicle" in section 4 of the *Road Traffic (Administration) Act 2008* (WA).
57. **Nightclub** means a place that has a nightclub licence under section 42 of the *Liquor Control Act 1988* (WA) or another place that is specified in writing by the State Emergency Coordinator, or a person authorised by the State Emergency Coordinator for that purpose, to be a nightclub for the purposes of these directions.
58. **Outdoor gym** means an outdoor space used for, and equipped with, facilities or equipment for exercise.
59. **Outdoor space** means any space that is not an indoor space.
60. **Patron** means a person who is not staff (and for the avoidance of doubt includes spectators).

61. **Physical distancing protocols** means:
- (a) generally maintaining a distance of 1.5 m from other persons (save for members of the relevant person's own group); and
 - (b) generally being in areas with a population density of less than 1 person per 2 square metres.

Note: Fleeting breaches of the above protocols (e.g. passing or brushing past a stranger while walking on a footpath) do not comprise a breach of physical distancing protocols.

62. **Place of worship** means premises used for religious activities such as a chapel, church, mosque, synagogue or temple or any other premises at the time it is being used for the purpose of **formal worship**.
63. **Playground** means an outdoor space used for, and equipped with facilities for, recreation, especially by children.
64. **Police officer** means a person appointed under Part I of the *Police Act 1892* (WA) to be a member of the Police Force of Western Australia.
65. **Premises** includes:
- (a) land (whether vacant or not); and
 - (b) land covered by water, whether permanently or temporarily or from time to time; and
 - (c) the whole or any part of a building or other structure, of whatever type and whether of a permanent or temporary nature; and
 - (d) a vehicle.
66. **Private gathering** means an organised or planned activity for a common recreational purpose but does not include a gathering of the kind referred to in paragraph 12(c) or (d).
67. **Prohibited gathering** means a gathering of two or more persons in a single undivided indoor space or a single undivided outdoor space at the same time (whether or not the space is a publicly accessible space), where there is not at least 2 square metres of space for each person at the gathering, but does not include an **exempt gathering** or a gathering that is otherwise permitted under paragraphs 16, 20 or 21 of these directions.
68. **Publicly accessible space** means space which is ordinarily open to the public or used by the public.

69. **Region** means the following regions of Western Australia:
- (a) the affected area;
 - (b) Gascoyne Region as described in Item 1 of Schedule 4 to the Planning Act;
 - (c) Goldfields-Esperance Region as described in Item 2 of Schedule 4 to the Planning Act;
 - (d) Great Southern Region as described in Item 3 of Schedule 4 to the Planning Act;
 - (e) Kimberley Region as described in Item 4 of Schedule 4 to the Planning Act;
 - (f) Mid West Region as described in Item 5 of Schedule 4 to the Planning Act;
 - (g) Pilbara Region as described in Item 7 of Schedule 4 to the Planning Act;
 - (h) South West Region as described in Item 8 of Schedule 4 to the Planning Act;
and
 - (i) Wheatbelt Region as described in Item 9 of Schedule 4 to the Planning Act.
70. **Relevant officer** means:
- (a) an authorised officer; or
 - (b) an **emergency officer**; or
 - (c) a responsible officer.
71. **Responsible officer** means:
- (a) an officer, employee or contractor of the Department of Health; or
 - (b) an officer, employee or contractor of a health services provider; or
 - (c) any other person authorised by the Chief Health Officer orally or in writing to perform a function for the purposes of these directions.
72. **Seated entertainment space** means a single undivided indoor space or a single undivided outdoor space, other than a major stadium, when that space is being used for the purpose of viewing or participating in:
- (a) a **seated performance** that is ticketed; or
 - (b) seated entertainment that is ticketed,
- whether on a for profit or not-for-profit basis, and that:

- (c) contains fixed seating; and
 - (d) is, or is in, premises other than a nightclub, casino or place of worship.
73. **Seated performance** means a performance (including a sporting competition or sporting performance that is in the same space as the seated entertainment venue) where the patrons observing or participating in the performance are seated throughout that performance, other than when accessing other facilities during the performance, including obtaining food and beverages.
74. **Skate park** means a facility specifically designed for skateboarding, rollerskating or rollerblading, containing structures such as ramps and basins.
75. **Special seating space** means a space with fixed seating that is a corporate box, a function room, a conference room or a meeting room, which includes, for the avoidance of doubt, any outdoor space with fixed seating that adjoins or is otherwise part of that special seating space.
76. **Spectator seating** means seating that is provided for patrons at the relevant major stadium or relevant premises for the purpose of viewing a sporting event, entertainment or a performance of any kind, but does not include any seating provided in a special seating space.
77. **Stadium operator** means the owner, occupier or person apparently in charge of the relevant major stadium.
78. **Staff** means a person who has responsibilities at a place as an officer or employee or in some other capacity (including a voluntary capacity) and includes:
- (a) in the case of a sporting activity, coaches and officials such as umpires, referees or scorekeepers; and
 - (b) in the case of a religious service at a place of worship:
 - (i) a person who leads or presides at the service, such as an imam, priest or rabbi; and
 - (ii) persons who assist the person who leads or presides at the service (including those who would ordinarily read from scripture or some other sacred text to a congregation or other group gathered to participate in the service); and

- (iii) persons present for the purpose of live streaming or recording the service.

79. **Sufficient dividing structure** means a wall or other structure which:

- (a) substantially comprises material that is impervious to air flow; and
- (b) is anchored to the ground or floor in a way which ensures that it cannot be lifted or pushed apart; and
- (c) either:
 - (i) reaches from the ground or floor to the ceiling (or roof if there is no ceiling); or
 - (ii) starts from the ground or floor and is at least 2 metres high from the ground or floor to its lowest vertical point measured from the ground or floor.

Note: In addition to meeting these requirements, a sufficient dividing structure must comply with any other legal requirements applicable to the structure in any way, including any legal requirements relating to the structural integrity of the structure (such as, but not limited to, requirements typically imposed or administered by local governments).

80. **Tier 1 exposure site** has the same meaning that it has in the Exposure Site (Western Australia) Directions.

81. **Tier 2 exposure site** has the same meaning that it has in the Exposure Site (Western Australia) Directions.

82. **Wildlife park** means an amusement park at which the dominant form of amusement or entertainment relates to any or all of exposure to or experiences with or viewing wildlife but, for the avoidance of doubt, does not include Perth Zoo.

Example: Caversham Wildlife Park.

PENALTIES

It may be an offence to fail to comply with any of these directions, punishable by imprisonment for up to 12 months or a fine of up to \$50,000 for individuals and \$250,000 for bodies corporate.
