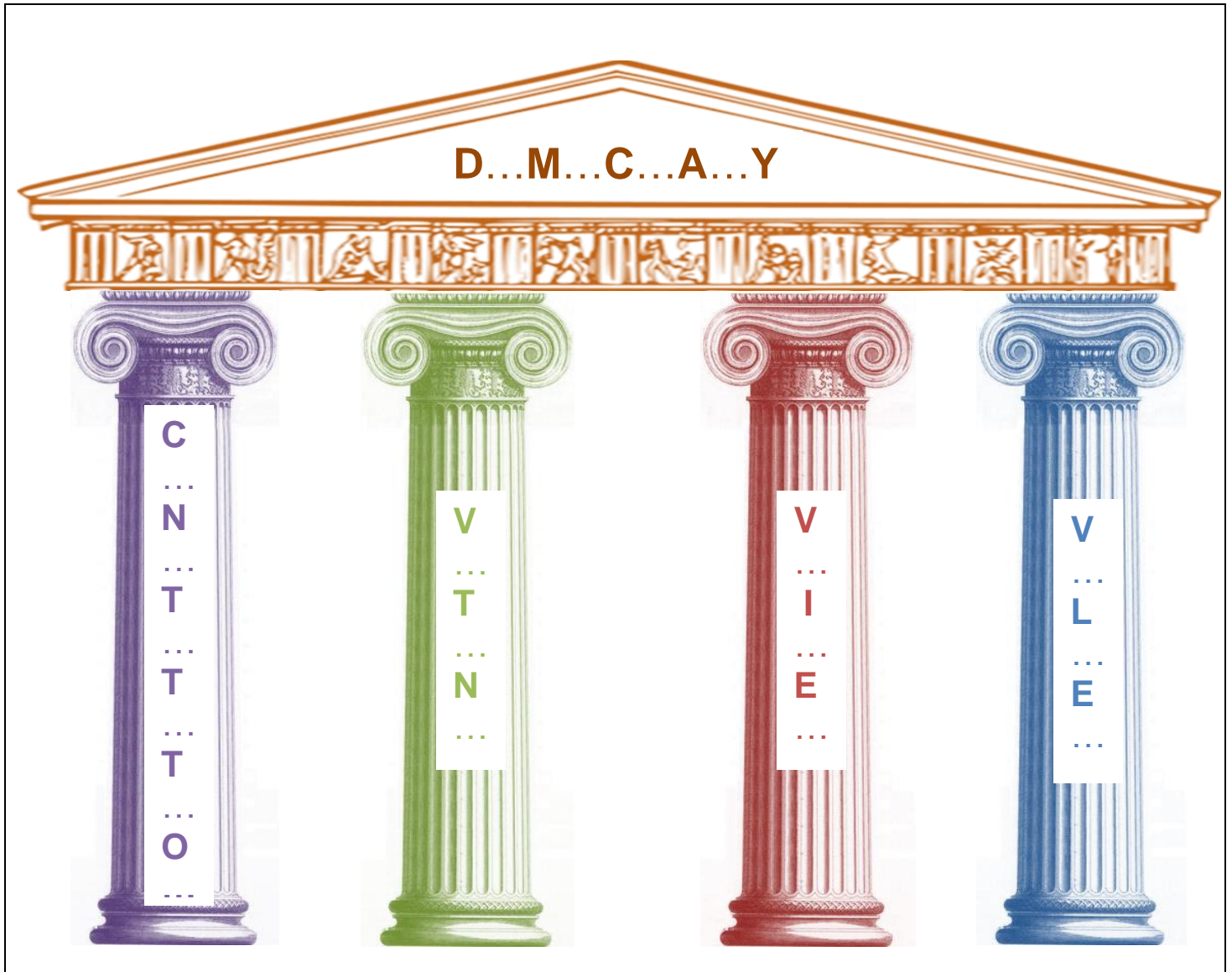

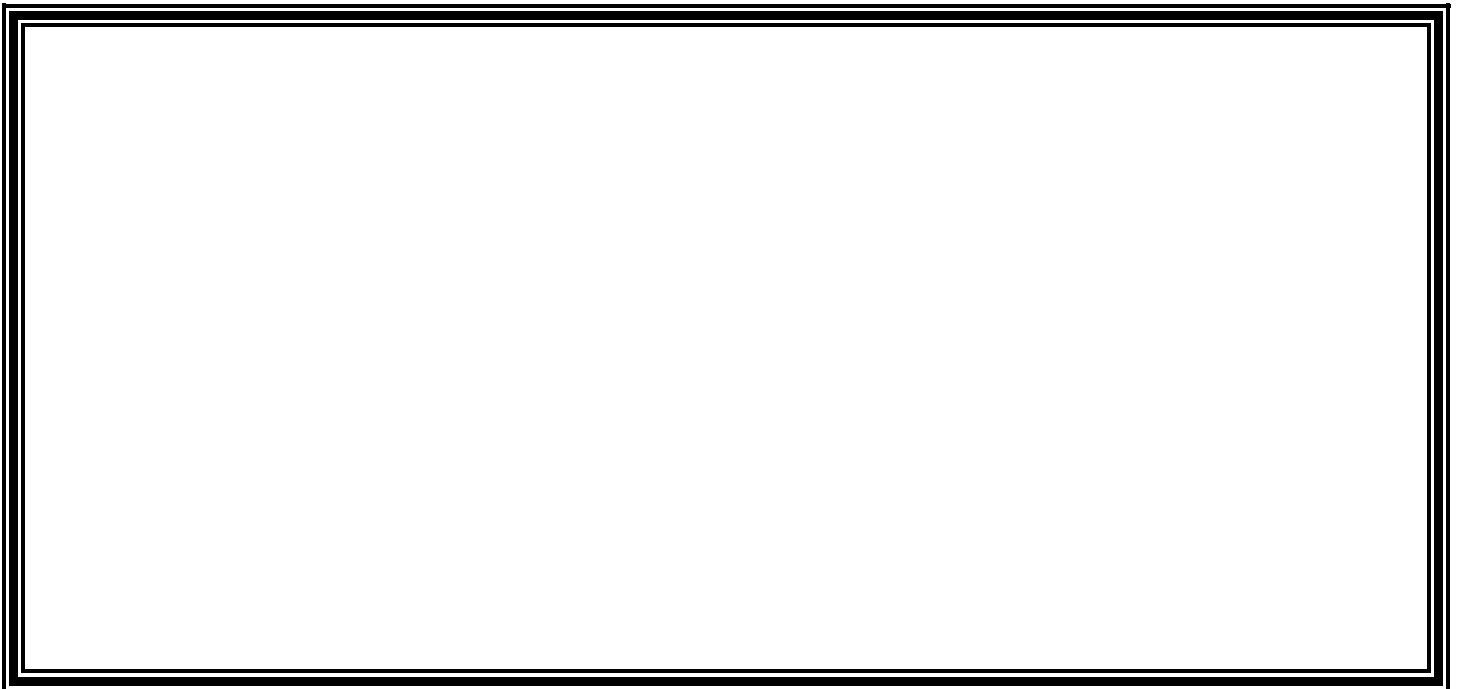
Activity 2: Characteristics of Australia's democracy
