C1. Description of Primary Business Activities

GTL Renewable is an Australian company that provides solar and storage solutions to residential and SME customers under Solar Power Purchase Agreements ("SPPA"). The systems normally range from 3KW to 30KW, with 5kWh to 20kWh energy storage system. Our office is based in Sydney, and our installed systems are over South Australia, Victoria, New South Wales and Queensland.

C2. Brief Description of the Business Model

GTL is going to offer SPPAs to residential and SME customers in WA. There will not be any upfront capital cost for the customers. Over the agreement period, GTL bills customers for the production of the systems.

Storage now is a mature technology, and it is proven that end users can save money with storage systems. GTL aims at helping customers that do not want to purchase the system upfront or want strong guarantee of the solar and storage products.

C3. Experience in Selling Energy Products and Services

GTL Renewable is selling same product packages in other states since 2016. Until today, our total generation has been over 8496.1 MWh, and over 1096 kWh energy storage systems have been installed.


