My army service A. I. F. began on 14/7/1941 at Northam Camp.

WX15019 my number and on my Discharge they have me down as 'Corporal' in the 105 Australian Light Field Ambulance.

The 'Corporal' word is wrong as I was nursing orderly T. G. I.I.I.

The '105' began on the 25/4/42 in Northam Camp (WA).

We were made up of a Headquarters, (4) Sections and Transport.

Being a Light Field Ambulance we were able to move our Unit at short notice or re-locate ourselves in quick time.

I was taken off strength of the '105' on the 13/7/45.

On the 29/7/45, I was interviewed and made a 'Corporal' with the B. B. C. A. U. = BRITISH-BORNEO CIVIL AFFAIRS UNIT.

I told the interviewer I was not 'Corporal' material and his response was "Have no fear, in a short time you could be delivering babies!" <u>I was not impressed</u>.

I was only with them a short time, as an edict came out allowing those who had been in the Services for (4) years or more to return to their home state. <u>I</u> <u>qualified</u>, and made arrangements to move out after returning all my gear that was marked for Borneo, I was very thankful.
