

Estimated Resident Population, March 2017


Key Facts


Western Australia

- Western Australia's estimated resident population increased by 0.3% (or 8,182 people) over the quarter and rose by 0.7% (or 18,398 people) through the year to March 2017, to stand at 2,575,970 people.
- Natural increase (births less deaths) were the largest contributor to population growth through the year to March 2017, followed by net overseas migration.
- Net interstate migration detracted from population growth through the year to March 2017.
- In annual average terms, WA's population increased by 0.7% (or 16,620 people) over the year to the March quarter 2017.

Australia

- Nationally, the estimated resident population rose by 0.5% (or 126,138 people) over the quarter and increased by 1.6% (or 389,072 people) in the 12 months to March 2017, to 24,511,773 people.
- Over the year to March 2017, the largest increase in estimated resident population by State was 2.4% in Victoria. The smallest increase was 0.1% in the Northern Territory.
- In annual average terms, Australia's population over the year to the March quarter grew by 1.6%.

Estimated Resident Population, June 2017


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
Western Australia

- Western Australia's estimated resident population increased by 0.2% (or 4,384 people) over the quarter and rose by 0.8% (or 21,403 people) through the year to June 2017, to stand at 2,580,354 people.
- WA's population growth of 21,403 people over the year to June 2017 comprised of:
 - a natural increase (births less deaths) of 20,024 people, contributing 0.8 percentage points to the 1.0% year-ended growth rate;
 - net overseas migration (arrivals less departures) of 13,101 people, contributing 0.5 percentage points;
 - net interstate migration (arrivals less departures) of -11,722 people, subtracting 0.50 percentage points from growth.
- In annual average terms, WA's population increased by 0.7% (or 18,299 people) over the year to the June guarter 2017.

Australia

- Nationally, the estimated resident population rose by 0.4% (or 87,160 people) over the quarter and increased by 1.6% (or 388,124 people) in the 12 months to June 2017, to 24,598,933 people.
- Over the year to June 2017, the largest increase in estimated resident population by State was 2.3% in Victoria. The smallest increase was 0.1% in the Northern Territory.
- In annual average terms, Australia's population over the year to June grew by 1.6%.

Estimated Resident Population, September 2017


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
Western Australia

- Western Australia's estimated resident population increased by 0.3% (or 6,781 people) over the quarter and rose by 0.9% (or 22,032 people) through the year to September 2017, to stand at 2,587,135 people.
- WA's population growth of 22,032 people over the year to September 2017 comprised of:
 - a natural increase (births less deaths) of 19,813 people, contributing 0.8 percentage points to the 0.9% year-ended growth rate;
 - net overseas migration (arrivals less departures) of 13,800 people, contributing 0.5 percentage points;
 - net interstate migration (arrivals less departures) of -11,581 people, contributing -0.45 percentage points.
- In annual average terms, WA's population increased by 0.8% (or 19,667 people) over the year to the September quarter 2017.

Australia

- Nationally, the estimated resident population rose by 0.4% (or 103,918 people) over the quarter and increased by 1.6% (or 395,613 people) in the 12 months to September 2017, to 24,702,851 people.
- Over the year to September 2017, the largest increase in estimated resident population by State was 2.4% in Victoria. The smallest increase was 0.0% in the Northern Territory.
- In annual average terms, Australia's population over the year to the September quarter grew by 1.6%.

Estimated Resident Population, December 2017


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
Western Australia

- Western Australia's estimated resident population increased by 0.1% (or 3,054 people) over the quarter and rose by 0.8% (or 21,395 people) through the year to December 2017, to stand at 2,584,768 people.
- WA's population growth of 21,395 people over the year to December 2017 comprised of:
 - a natural increase (births less deaths) of 20,004 people, contributing 0.8 percentage points to the 0.8% year-ended growth rate;
 - net overseas migration (arrivals less departures) of 14,209 people, contributing 0.6 percentage points;
 - net interstate migration (arrivals less departures) of -12,818 people, detracting 0.5 percentage points.
- In annual average terms, WA's population increased by 0.8% (or 19,453 people) over the year to the December quarter 2017.

Australia

- Nationally, the estimated resident population rose by 0.3% (or 68,731 people) over the quarter and increased by 1.6% (or 387,969 people) in the 12 months to December 2017, to 24,770,709 people.
- Over the year to December 2017, the largest increase in estimated resident population by State was 2.3% in Victoria. The smallest increase was 0.2% in the Northern Territory.
- In annual average terms, Australia's population over the year to the December quarter grew by 1.7%.
