

# **Estimated Resident Population, March 2018**


### **Key Facts**


#### Western Australia

- Western Australia's estimated resident population increased by 0.3% (or 7,119 people) over the quarter and rose by 0.8% (or 20,419 people) through the year to March 2018, to stand at 2,591,887 people.
- WA's population growth of 20,419 people over the year to March 2018 comprised of:
  - a natural increase (births less deaths) of 19,768 people, contributing 0.8 percentage points to the 0.8% year-ended growth rate;
  - net overseas migration (arrivals less departures) of 13,348 people, contributing 0.5 percentage points;
  - net interstate migration (arrivals less departures) of -12,040 people, contributing
    0.47 percentage points.
- In annual average terms, WA's population increased by 0.8% (or 19,453 people) over the year to the December quarter 2017.

### Australia

- Nationally, the estimated resident population rose by 0.5% (or 128,368 people) over the quarter and increased by 1.6% (or 387,473 people) in the 12 months to March 2018, to 24,899,077 people.
- Over the year to March 2018, the largest increase in estimated resident population by State was 2.2% in Victoria. The smallest increase was 0.2% in the Northern Territory.
- In annual average terms, Australia's population over the year to the March quarter grew by 1.6%.

# **Estimated Resident Population, June 2018**


## **Key Facts**


### Western Australia

- Western Australia's estimated resident population increased by 0.2% (or 4,558 people) over the quarter and rose by 0.8% (or 21,684 people) through the year to June 2018, to stand at 2,595,877 people.
- WA's population growth of 21,684 people over the year to June 2018 comprised of:
  - a natural increase (births less deaths) of 19,490 people, contributing 0.8 percentage points to the 0.8% year-ended growth rate;
  - net overseas migration (arrivals less departures) of 13,494 people, contributing 0.5 percentage points;
  - net interstate migration (arrivals less departures) of -11,300 people, contributing -0.44 percentage points.
- In annual average terms, WA's population increased by 0.8% (or 20,247 people) over the year to the June quarter 2018.

### Australia

- Nationally, the estimated resident population rose by 0.4% (or 92,160 people) over the quarter and increased by 1.6% (or 390,509 people) in the 12 months to June 2018, to 24,992,369 people.
- Over the year to June 2018, the largest increase in estimated resident population by State was 2.2% in Victoria. The largest decrease was 0.1% in the Northern Territory.
- In annual average terms, Australia's population over the year to the June quarter grew by 1.6%.




### Western Australia

- Western Australia's estimated resident population increased by 0.3% (or 7,227 people) over the quarter and rose by 0.9% (or 22,617 people) through the year to September 2018, to stand at 2,602,419 people.
- WA's population growth of 22,617 people over the year to September 2018 comprised of:
  - a natural increase (births less deaths) of 19,300 people, contributing 0.7 percentage points to the 0.9% year-ended growth rate;
  - net overseas migration (arrivals less departures) of 13,621 people, contributing 0.5 percentage points;
  - net interstate migration (arrivals less departures) of -10,304 people, contributing -0.40 percentage points.
- In annual average terms, WA's population increased by 0.8% (or 20,672 people) over the year to the September quarter 2018.

### Australia

- Nationally, the estimated resident population rose by 0.4% (or 109,057 people) over the quarter and increased by 1.6% (or 395,101 people) in the 12 months to September 2018, to 25,101,917 people.
- Over the year to September 2018, the largest increase in estimated resident population by State was 2.2% in Victoria. The largest decrease was 0.2% in the Northern Territory.
- In annual average terms, Australia's population grew by 1.6 over the year to the September quarter.




#### Western Australia

- Western Australia's estimated resident population increased by 0.2% (or 4,399 people) over the quarter and rose by 0.9% (or 23,961 people) through the year to December 2018, to stand at 2,606,338 people.
- WA's population growth of 23,961 people over the year to December 2018 comprised of:
  - a natural increase (births less deaths) of 18,601 people, contributing 0.7 percentage points to the 0.9% year-ended growth rate;
  - net overseas migration (arrivals less departures) of 14,863 people, contributing 0.6 percentage points;
  - net interstate migration (arrivals less departures) of -9,503 people, contributing -0.4 percentage points.
- In annual average terms, WA's population increased by 0.8% (or 21,515 people) over the year to the December quarter 2018.

### Australia

- Nationally, the estimated resident population rose by 0.3% (or 78,430 people) over the quarter and increased by 1.6% (or 404,783 people) in the 12 months to December 2018, to 25,180,234 people.
- Over the year to December 2018, the largest increase in estimated resident population by State was 2.2% in Victoria. The largest decrease was 0.4% in the Northern Territory.
- In annual average terms, Australia's population over the year to the June quarter grew by 1.6%.
