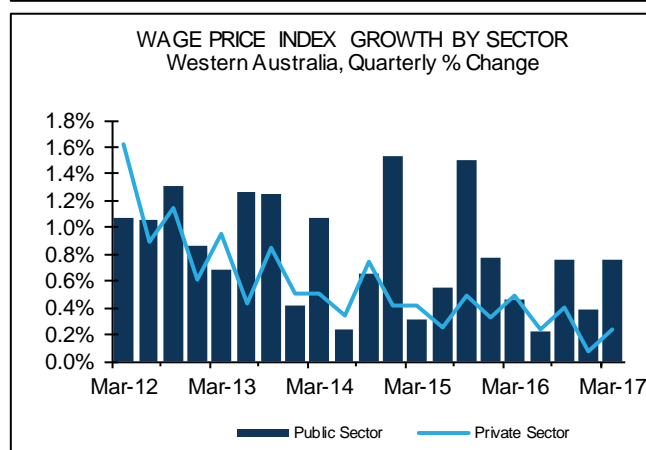
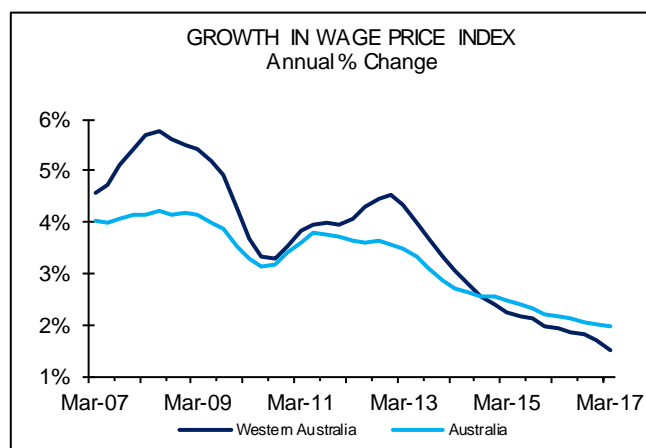
Key Facts

Western Australia

- Western Australia's Wage Price Index increased by 0.3% over the quarter and rose by 1.5% in annual average terms to March 2017.
- The State's Public Sector Wage Price Index increased by 0.8% over the quarter and rose by 2.3% in annual average terms to March 2017.
- This compares with the State's Private Sector Wage Price Index, which increased by 0.2% over the quarter and rose by 1.3% over the year.

Australia

- Nationally, the Wage Price Index rose by 0.4% over the quarter and increased by 2.0% in annual average terms to March 2017.
- Over the year to March, the largest increase in Wage Price Index by State was 2.3% in Tasmania. The smallest increase was 1.5% in Western Australia.
- Australia's Public Sector Wage Price Index increased by 0.6% over the quarter and rose by 2.3% in annual average terms to March 2017.
- Comparatively, Australia's Private Sector Wage Price Index increased by 0.3% over the quarter and rose by 1.8% during the year.

Wage Price Index, June 2017

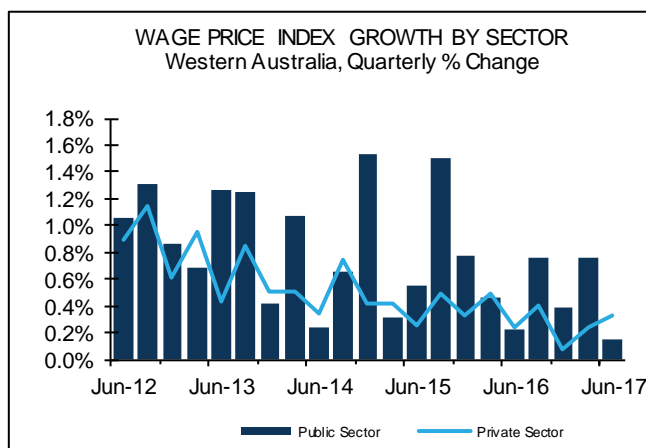
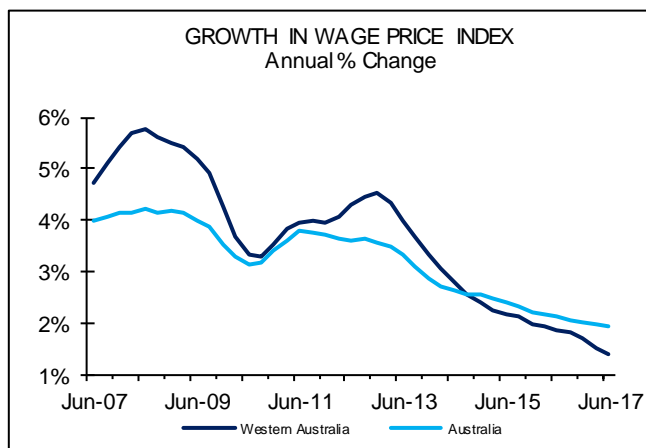
Key Facts

Western Australia

- Western Australia's Wage Price Index increased by 0.3% over the quarter and rose by 1.4% in 2016-17.
- The State's Public Sector Wage Price Index increased by 0.2% over the quarter and rose by 2.1% in 2016-17.
- This compares with the State's Private Sector Wage Price Index, which increased by 0.3% over the quarter and rose by 1.2% over the year.

Australia

- Nationally, the Wage Price Index rose by 0.4% over the quarter and increased by 2.0% in 2016-17.
- In 2016-17, the largest increase in Wage Price Index by State was 2.2% in Tasmania. The smallest increase was 1.4% in Western Australia.
- Australia's Public Sector Wage Price Index increased by 0.4% over the quarter and rose by 2.4% in 2016-17.
- Comparatively, Australia's Private Sector Wage Price Index increased by 0.4% over the quarter and rose by 1.8% during the year.

Wage Price Index, September 2017

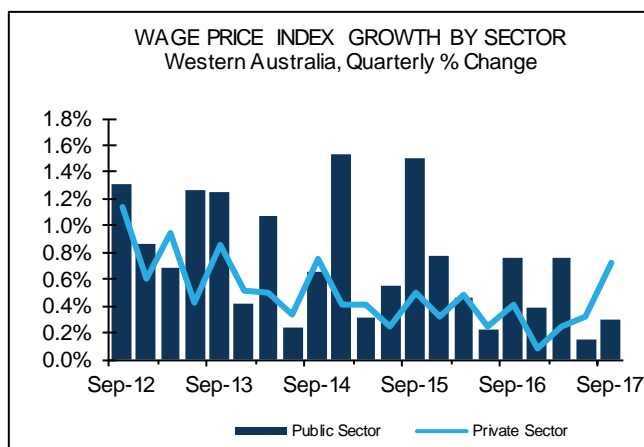
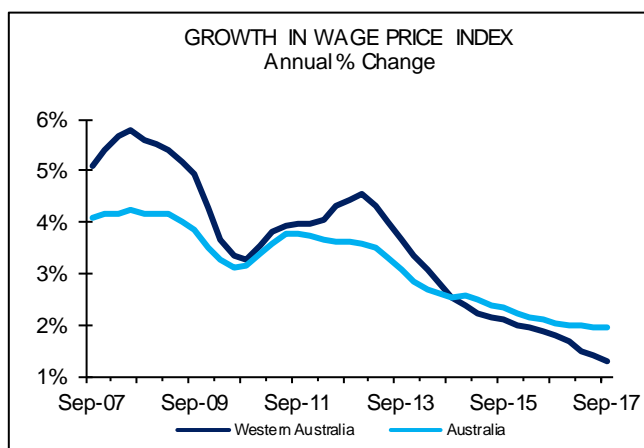
Key Facts

Western Australia

- Western Australia's Wage Price Index increased by 0.6% over the quarter and rose by 1.3% in annual average terms to September 2017.
- The State's Public Sector Wage Price Index increased by 0.3% over the quarter and rose by 1.9% in annual average terms to September 2017.
- This compares with the State's Private Sector Wage Price Index, which increased by 0.7% over the quarter and rose by 1.2% over the year.

Australia

- Nationally, the Wage Price Index rose by 0.8% over the quarter and increased by 2.0% in annual average terms to September 2017.
- Over the year to September, the largest increase in Wage Price Index by State was 2.2% in Tasmania. The smallest increase was 1.3% in Western Australia.
- Australia's Public Sector Wage Price Index increased by 0.8% over the quarter and rose by 2.4% in annual average terms to September 2017.
- Comparatively, Australia's Private Sector Wage Price Index increased by 0.8% over the quarter and rose by 1.8% during the year.

Wage Price Index, December 2017

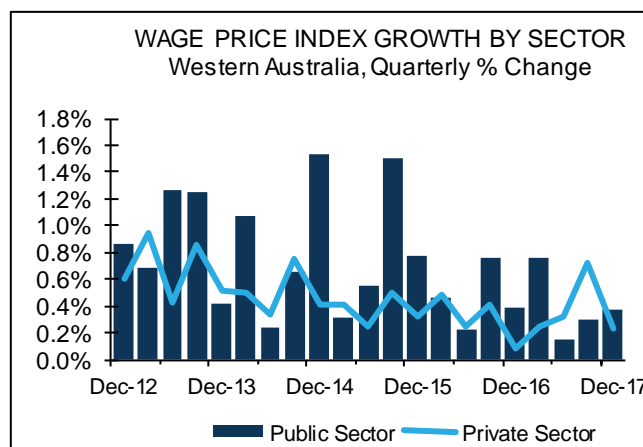
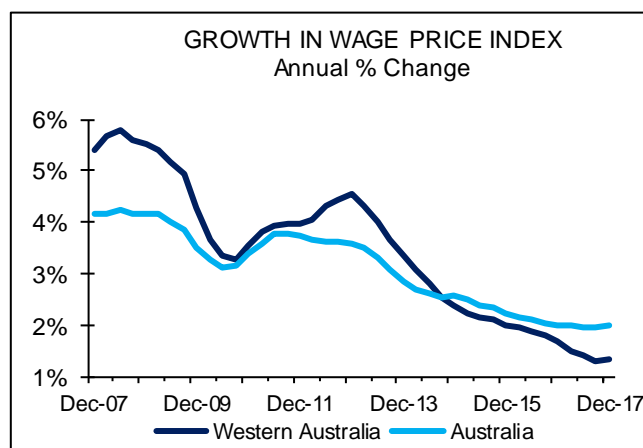
Key Facts

Western Australia

- Western Australia's Wage Price Index increased by 0.3% over the quarter and rose by 1.4% in annual average terms to December 2017.
- The State's Public Sector Wage Price Index increased by 0.4% over the quarter and rose by 1.8% in annual average terms to December 2017.
- This compares with the State's Private Sector Wage Price Index, which increased by 0.2% over the quarter and rose by 1.2% over the year.

Australia

- Nationally, the Wage Price Index rose by 0.5% over the quarter and increased by 2.0% in annual average terms to December 2017.
- Over the year to December, the largest increase in Wage Price Index by State was 2.2% in Tasmania. The smallest increase was 1.4% in Western Australia.
- Australia's Public Sector Wage Price Index increased by 0.6% over the quarter and rose by 2.4% in annual average terms to December 2017.
- Comparatively, Australia's Private Sector Wage Price Index increased by 0.4% over the quarter and rose by 1.9% during the year.
