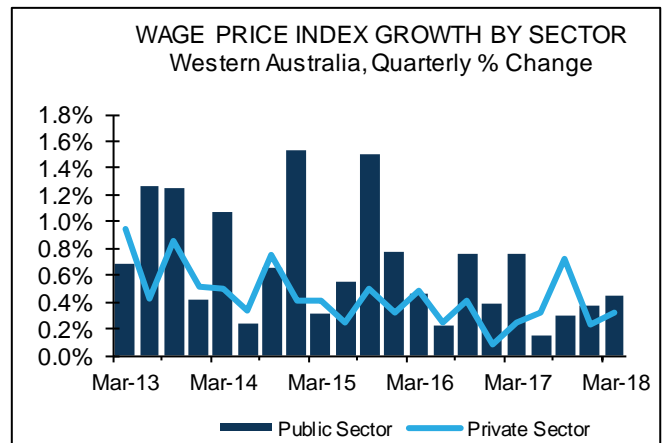
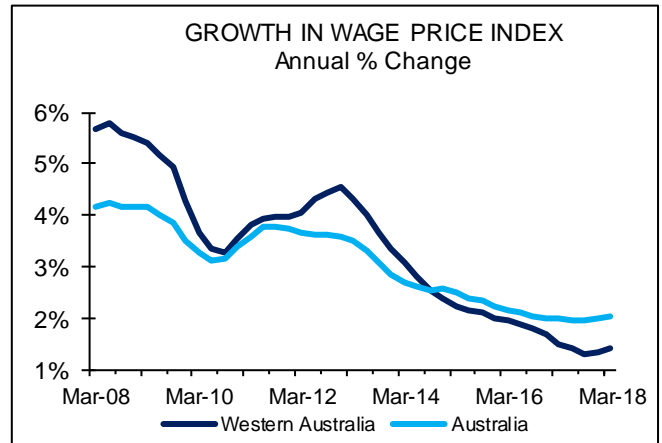
Key Facts

Western Australia

- Western Australia's Wage Price Index increased by 0.3% over the quarter and rose by 1.4% in annual average terms to March 2018.
- The State's Public Sector Wage Price Index increased by 0.4% over the quarter and rose by 1.6% in annual average terms to March 2018.
- This compares with the State's Private Sector Wage Price Index, which increased by 0.3% over the quarter and rose by 1.4% over the year.

Australia

- Nationally, the Wage Price Index rose by 0.4% over the quarter and increased by 2.0% in annual average terms to March 2018.
- Over the year to March, the largest increase in Wage Price Index by State was 2.2% in Victoria. The smallest increase was 1.4% in Western Australia and the Northern Territory.
- Australia's Public Sector Wage Price Index increased by 0.5% over the quarter and rose by 2.4% in annual average terms to March 2018.
- Comparatively, Australia's Private Sector Wage Price Index increased by 0.4% over the quarter and rose by 1.9% during the year.

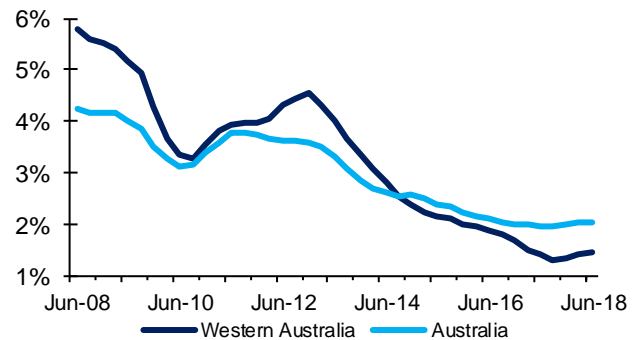
Western Australia

- Western Australia's Wage Price Index increased by 0.3% over the quarter and rose by 1.5% in annual average terms to June 2018.
- The State's Public Sector Wage Price Index increased by 0.1% over the quarter and rose by 1.4% in annual average terms to June 2018.
- This compares with the State's Private Sector Wage Price Index, which increased by 0.3% over the quarter and rose by 1.5% over the year.

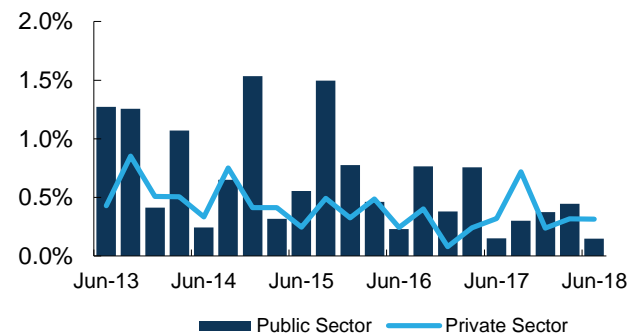
Australia

- Nationally, the Wage Price Index rose by 0.4% over the quarter and increased by 2.1% in annual average terms to June 2018.
- Over the year to June, the largest increase in the Wage Price Index by State was 2.3% in Victoria and Tasmania. The smallest increase was 1.3% in the Northern Territory.
- Australia's Public Sector Wage Price Index increased by 0.4% over the quarter and rose by 2.4% in annual average terms to June 2018.
- Comparatively, Australia's Private Sector Wage Price Index increased by 0.4% over the quarter and rose by 1.9% during the year.

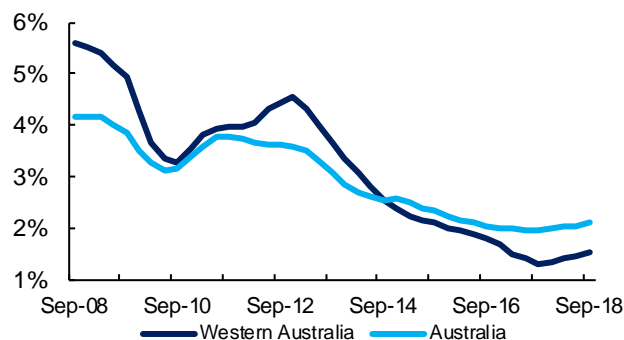
Western Australia

- Western Australia's Wage Price Index increased by 0.6% over the quarter and rose by 1.5% in annual average terms to September 2018.
- The State's Public Sector Wage Price Index increased by 0.5% over the quarter and rose by 1.4% in annual average terms to September 2018.
- This compares with the State's Private Sector Wage Price Index, which increased by 0.6% over the quarter and rose by 1.6% over the year.

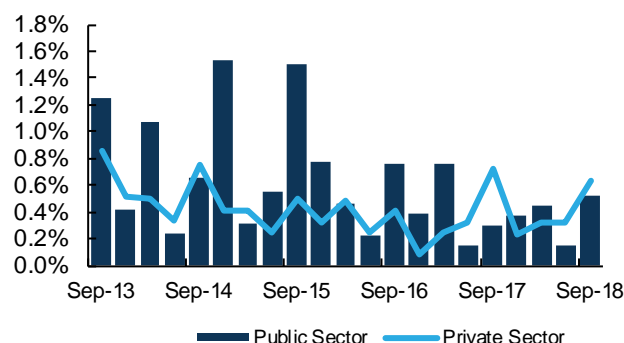
Australia

- Nationally, the Wage Price Index rose by 1.0% over the quarter and increased by 2.1% in annual average terms to September 2018.
- Over the year to September, the largest increase in Wage Price Index by State was 2.4% in Victoria. The smallest increase was 1.4% in the Northern Territory.
- Australia's Public Sector Wage Price Index increased by 0.9% over the quarter and rose by 2.4% in annual average terms to September 2018.
- Comparatively, Australia's Private Sector Wage Price Index increased by 1.0% over the quarter and rose by 2.0% during the year.

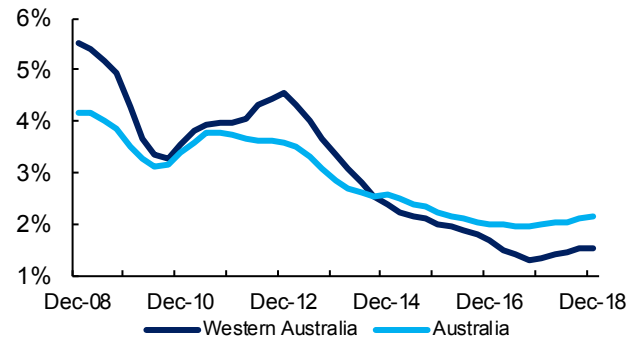
Western Australia

- This compares with the State's Private Sector Wage Price Index, which increased by 0.4% over the quarter and rose by 1.6% over the year.

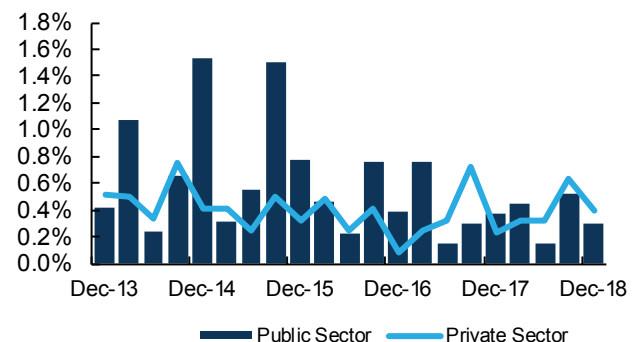
Australia

- Nationally, the Wage Price Index rose by 0.5% over the quarter and increased by 2.2% in annual average terms to December 2018.
- Over the year to December, the largest increase in Wage Price Index by State was 2.5% in Tasmania. The smallest increase was 1.5% in Western Australia.
- Australia's Public Sector Wage Price Index increased by 0.7% over the quarter and rose by 2.4% in annual average terms to December 2018.
- Comparatively, Australia's Private Sector Wage Price Index increased by 0.5% over the quarter and rose by 2.1% during the year.
