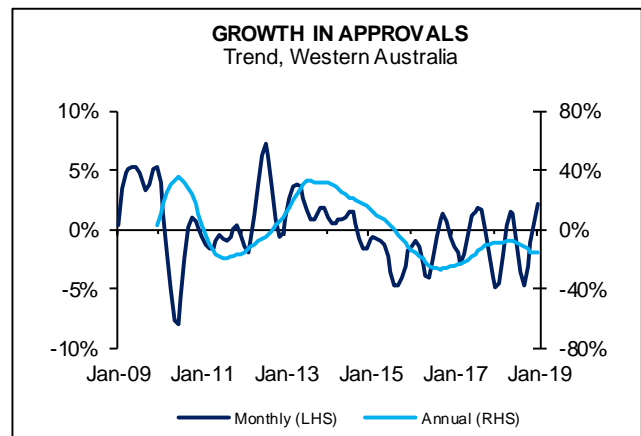
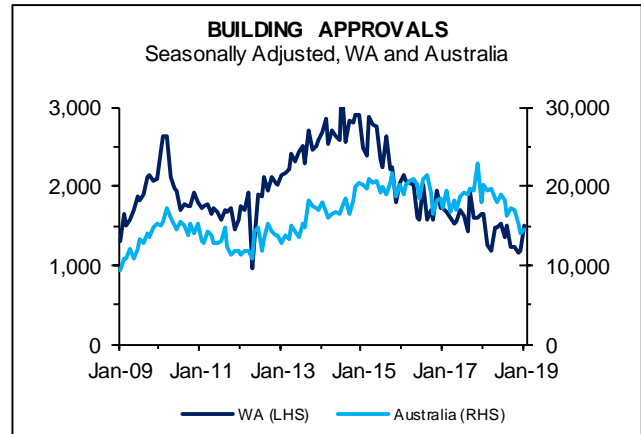
Key Facts

Western Australia

- Seasonally adjusted building approvals increased by 28.8% to 1,508 between December 2018 and January 2019.
- Approvals fell by 17.8% in annual average terms and dropped by 3.5% over the three months to January 2019.
- Trend building approvals in Western Australia increased by 2.2% between December and January, and fell by 16.4% in annual average terms.

Australia

- Australia's seasonally adjusted building approvals rose by 2.5% to 14,395 between December 2018 and January 2019.
- Approvals dropped by 9.3% in annual average terms and decreased by 13.1% in the three months ending in January.
- Australia's trend building approvals fell by 3.2% between December and January, and dropped by 8.4% in annual average terms.
- The largest annual average increase in trend approvals by jurisdiction was 56.0% in the Australian Capital Territory. The largest decrease was 16.4% in Western Australia.

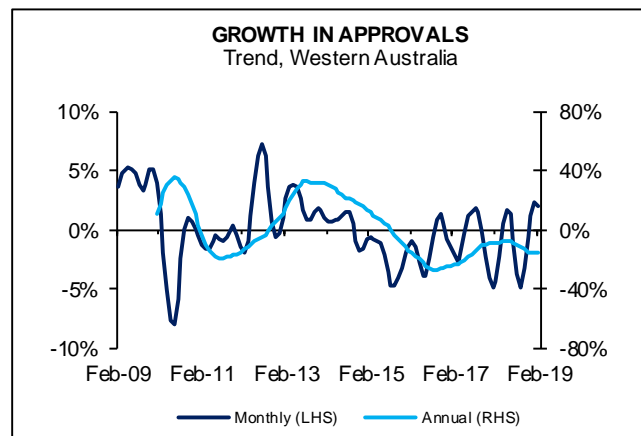
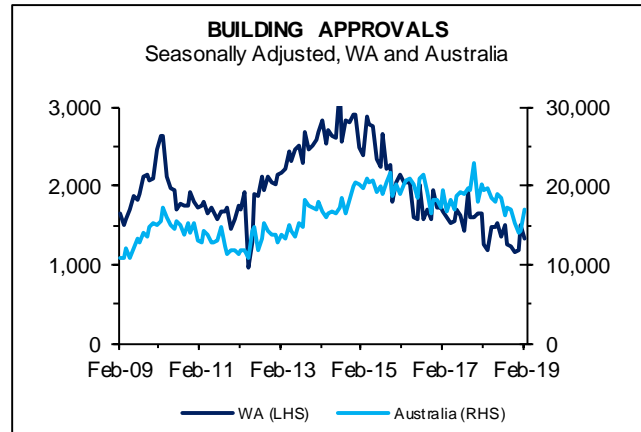

- Seasonally adjusted building approvals decreased by 10.9% to 1,339 between January and February 2019.
- Approvals fell by 15.5% in annual average terms and grew by 10.8% over the three months to February 2019.
- Trend building approvals in Western Australia increased by 2.0% between January and February, and fell by 15.6% in annual average terms.

Australia

- Australia's seasonally adjusted building approvals rose by 19.1% to 17,074 between January and February 2019.
- Approvals dropped by 10.4% in annual average terms and decreased by 7.9% in the three months ending in February.
- Australia's trend building approvals rose by 0.4% between January and February, and dropped by 10.3% in annual average terms.
- The largest annual average increase in trend approvals by jurisdiction was 49.1% in the Australian Capital Territory. The largest decrease was 15.6% in Western Australia.

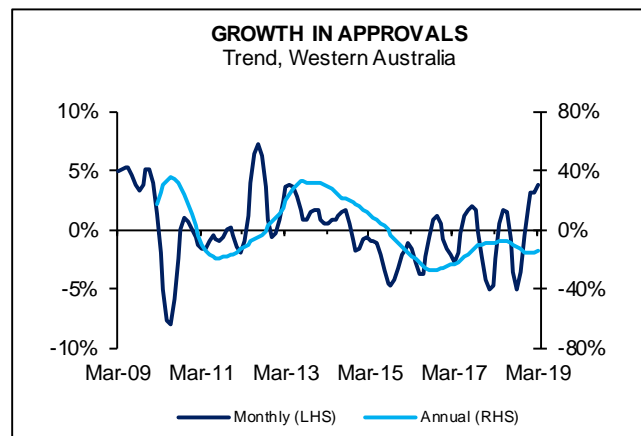
