Building Approvals, April 2020


Key Facts


Western Australia

- Seasonally adjusted building approvals increased by 12.4% to 1,350 between March and April 2020.
- Approvals fell by 9.5% in annual average terms and grew by 10.4% over the three months to April 2020.
- Trend building approvals in Western Australia increased by 2.3% between March and April, and fell by 8.3% in annual average terms.

Australia

- Australia's seasonally adjusted building approvals fell by 1.8% to 15,294 between March and April 2020
- Approvals dropped by 11.0% in annual average terms and increased by 7.3% in the three months ending in April.
- Australia's trend building approvals rose by 1.0% between March and April, and dropped by 11.4% in annual average terms.
- The largest annual average increase in trend approvals by jurisdiction was 0.1% in South Australia. The largest decrease was 36.4% in the Australian Capital Territory.
