REQUEST FOR APPROVAL TO PRINT – WELLNESS IMPROVEMENT THROUGH PETS IN THE WORKPLACE BILL 2020

### PURPOSE

To obtain Cabinet approval to print the Wellness Improvement Through Pets in the Workplace Bill 2020 for the promotion of mental and physical well-being of employees by requiring employers to facilitate the attendance of pets in the workplace.

### BACKGROUND

On 23 October 2018, Cabinet approved the drafting of a Bill requiring employers to facilitate the attendance of pets in the workplace.

A key component of the Bill requires employers to prepare and implement pet access plans, in consultation with employee representatives. Access plans must be registered with the Board for the Facilitation of Pet Workplace Access (Board) and employers are required to arrange for an authorised auditor to conduct an annual audit of compliance with their access plans. Annual audit opinions must be submitted to the Board within thirty days of being provided to an employer by an authorised auditor.

The Bill recognises, however, that there are many different kinds of workplaces throughout the State and that it may not always be possible to accommodate the regular attendance of pets in some workplaces for extended periods is of time. For these reasons, section 86 sets out circumstances in which a workplace is to be considered an exempt workplace.

Section 87 imposes certain requirements on employers in the event that a workplace is an exempt workplace pursuant to section 86. One such requirement is that, bi-annually, employers are to facilitate a "Bring Your Pet to Work Day".

These proposed regulations set out the reasonable obligations that are to apply to employers and employees on the relevant days, to ensure the safety of all persons and pets in the workplace. Attachment A contains a more detailed explanation of each proposed regulation.

To implement the necessary changes to workplaces to properly facilitate and manage having fogs in the workplace, access plans and online training modules will need to be developed at the cost of the State Government.

### RELATION TO GOVERNMENT POLICY

The Bill implements an election commitment and the Government has announced its intention to improve mental and physical well-being in the workplace.

### URGENCY

The Bill is required to be urgently introduced into Parliament in the Autumn sitting to ensure the legislation is passed and operational by the end of 2020.

### CONSULTATION

There has been extensive consultation across the public sector agencies and community, health, mental health, union, employer and not-for-profit groups.

This occurred via the release of a discussion paper, with submissions informing the drafting and release fo a Green Bill for a three-month comment period. Comments received during this period were overwhelmingly supportive with the exception of one group, the Network of Outrage and Fear Umbrella Committee (NOFUN).

In representing its members views, NOFUN expressed concern at the likelihood of lost revenue and inadequeate safeguards to protect non-pet owning employees from potential allegric reations.

The State Solicitor's Office was consulted during the drafting of the previous version of the Bill which was considered buy Cabinet in October 2019, and their advice taken.

In developing the Act and supporting regulations, there has been widespread consultation with public sector agencies and community, health, mental health, union, employer and not-for-profit groups. This occurred via the release of a discussion paper, with submissions informing the drafting and release of a Green Bill for a three-month comment period.

With the exception of one stakeholder group, the Network of Outrage and Fear Umbrella Committee (NOFUN), the proposed *Bring Your Pet to Work Day Regulations 2020* received the support of all stakeholders.

In representing its member views, NOFUN expressed concern at the likelihood of lost revenue and inadequate safeguards to protect non-pet owning employees from potential allergic reactions on "Bring Your Pet to Work Days".

Reviews conducted in other jurisdictions that have enacted similar legislation indicate, overwhelmingly, improved morale and increased productivity as a result of measures to promote pet attendance in the workplace.

In addition, the agency consulted with the medical profession, in particular respiratory and dermatological specialists, in formulating the proposed regulations dealing with health safeguards. Those consulted confirmed that the safeguards represent best practice.
