State Recovery training initiatives

- Review of Skills, Training and Workforce Development
- \$57 million Skills Ready package
- \$167 million TAFE infrastructure Package
- Defence workforce initiatives
- Commonwealth JobTrainer Fund National Partnership Agreement: up to \$51 million for WA















Free short courses (skill sets)

- "COVID Critical" skill sets target business needs (\$9 million)
 - Free to all including existing workers
 - ❖ Infection control training (cross sector, retail, food, transport and logistics)
 - ❖ COVID-19 direct care (WA)
 - Entry to aged and disability care, including infection control training (Cw)
- "Recovery" skill sets target jobseekers (\$25 million)
 - Free to eligible cohorts: youth and jobseekers
 - Nationally recognised units, credit towards full qualifications
 - Provide individual support
 - ❖ Work in community care
 - ❖ Job Ready Basics















More affordable qualifications

- · Lower Fees, Local Skills initiative expanded
- Student fees reduced between 50% and 72%
- Fees for youth and concession-eligible students capped at \$400 for year, \$1200 for non-concession students
- 180 courses covering priority areas including:
 - Social assistance and allied health, agriculture, defence (engineering trades), construction, civil construction, hospitality, cybersecurity, business, project management

Supporting apprentices and trainees

- Out of contract register to help connect apprentices and trainees to new employers
- Free training for displaced apprentices and trainees to enable them to continue off-the-job training for 6 months while looking for a new employer (\$1.9 million)
- Re-engagement incentive for employers: \$6000 for apprentice, \$3000 for trainee (\$4.9 million)
