Pluto-KGP Interconnector: Local Content, Industry Participation and Community Development



Executive Summary

- 1. The Pluto Acceleration Project will deliver the acceleration of some gas from the offshore Pluto fields through the Pluto-KGP Interconnector for processing at the North West Shelf (NWS) Project's Karratha Gas Plant (KGP).
- 2. Woodside announced a final investment decision on the Pluto-KGP Interconnector Project in November 2019. <u>Construction commenced in January 2021 on the five-kilometre, 30-inch pipeline to the KGP,</u> which will be constructed along the existing Dampier to Bunbury Natural Gas Pipeline (DBNGP) corridor.
- 3. DDG Operations Pty Ltd, part of Australian Gas Infrastructure Group (AGIG), has been awarded the contract for the construction of the pipeline and its ongoing operation and maintenance.
- 4. Construction of the Pluto-KGP Interconnector will <u>employ an average of 250 workers</u> with the <u>workforce expected to peak at 320 jobs</u>. After start-up, responsibility for Pluto gas processing via the interconnector will transfer to our existing operations workforce, which is primarily based in WA.
- 5. <u>Contracts have been awarded to WA-based companies</u> NEMMS JV for civil works and Civmec for the supply and fabrication of structural steel, piping, modules and skids.
- 6. The NWS Project made a final investment decision in December 2020 for the additional required infrastructure to receive third party gas at the KGP. <u>Construction commenced in January 2021 and is expected to employ a peak workforce of 50.</u>
- 7. The Pluto-KGP Interconnector will optimise production across both facilities, <u>underpin</u> <u>sustainable and long-term operations</u> at both plants while supporting ongoing community development activities in the Pilbara. Start-up of the Pluto-KGP Interconnector is targeted in H1 2022.
- 8. Woodside is a long-term LNG and domestic gas producer operating in the Pilbara. Woodside has a strong track-record of significant contributions to Karratha and surrounding communities through local employment, contracting, sponsorships and social investment. Community development activities associated with the on-going operations of the Karratha Gas Plant and Pluto LNG Plant are based on thorough research and a strong understanding of community issues and relationships.
