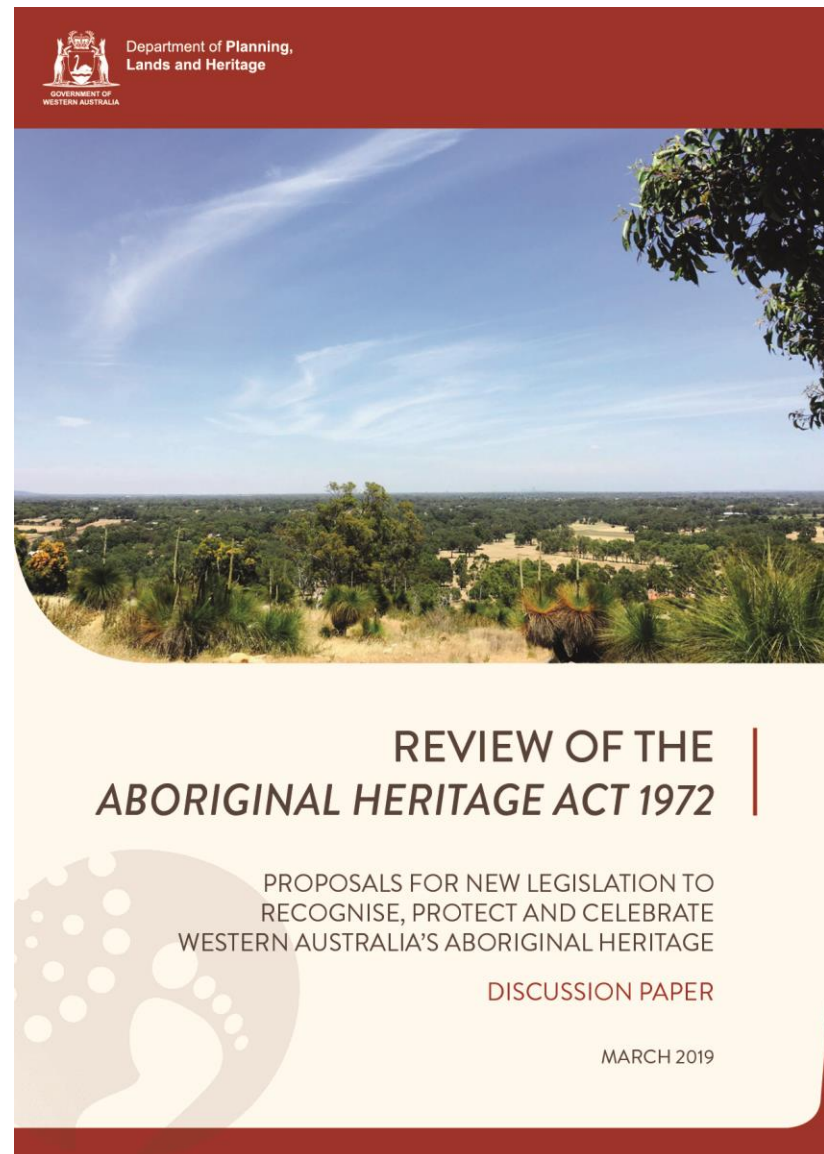

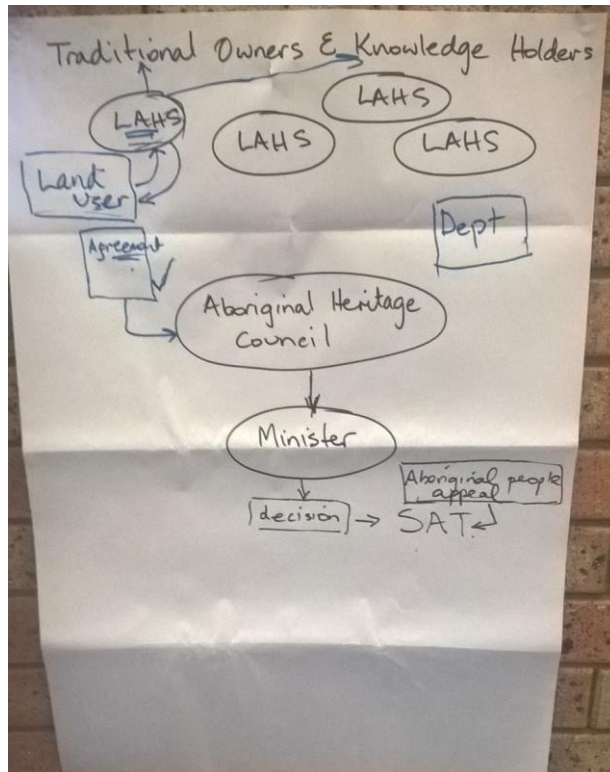

- Bibbanarra Bore should be registered for Yiningarra people too.

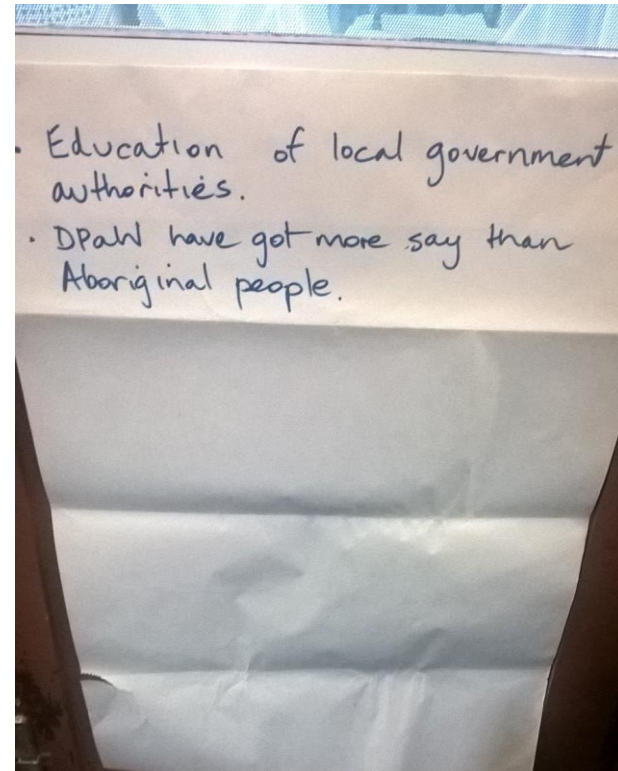
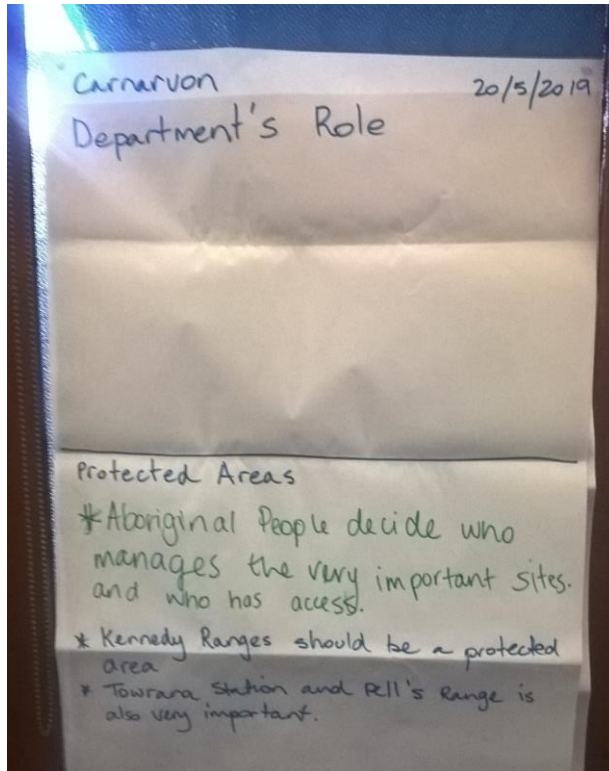
