### Topic 1: WHAT NEEDS LEGISLATION TO PROTECT IT?

- Ceremony Grounds,
- Place or Site of value to Aboriginal community

## **SOLUTION – OPTION**

Community and Elders decide what should be protected.

### TOPIC 2: WHAT ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITES ARE NEEDED?

- Aboriginal community
  - o #1 Authority
  - o #1 Priority
- Site Register (Government)
- Minister (in consultation with community)
- NO need for the ACMC;
  - o Government deals directly with community
- Ministerial override means info given by community is pointless.

#### **SOLUTION – OPTION**

- Aboriginal people and their role to be recognised in the legislation
  - o What is a Site
  - o What is protected
  - o What can be impacted
- Minister <u>must</u> consult with community before agreeing to impacts on a site

- Traditional Owners
  - o Elders in the community
- NO role for the ACMC in decision making
  - o Government directly with community
- Representative Body
- Some informants are too close to proponents (mining companies)
