I, HELEN MARGARET VINEY COGAN, of Contains sensitive information say as follows:

 This statement is provided in response to the witness summons to give evidence, dated 30 April 2021 and issued pursuant to section 9 of the *Royal Commissions Act 1968* (WA), which is directed to me by the Perth Casino Royal Commission (PCRC). This statement addresses the matters set out in Schedule 1 to the summons.

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- I am a former member of the Gaming and Wagering Commission of Western Australia (GWC).
- This statement is true and correct to the best of my knowledge and belief. The views I
 express in this statement are from my own knowledge and recollection, except where I
 indicate otherwise.

QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE

- I hold a Bachelor of Laws from the University of Western Australia and a Bachelor of Laws from the University of Witwatersrand in South Africa.
- I do not hold any formal qualifications specifically in relation to the regulation of casinos or casino gambling.
- Between 2000 and 2009, I was a director of the Daughters of Charity Services and from 2005 to October 2020 I was a member of the Council and Executive Council of the National Trust of Australia (WA).
- Between 2007 and May 2016, I was a foundational member of the Liquor Commission of Western Australia.

ROLE ON THE GAMING AND WAGERING COMMISSION

Date and length of appointment, remuneration and time spent

- After receiving my summons for the PCRC I contacted the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries (Department) to obtain information about my tenure and remuneration.
- 9. I am informed by the Department that I was appointed to the GWC in January 2006 until December 2011, and then again for a short period in 2012 until the vacancy created

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by the resignation of Ms Katie Hodson-Thomas was filled. I do not recall the precise dates.

- 10. I recall that Barry Sargeant approached me to ask if I would join the GWC. I don't recall why Barry asked me. I assume it had to do with my legal experience, as at the time I was a lawyer at the State Solicitor's Office and I would from time-to-time provide legal advice to the then Department of Racing, Gaming and Liquor. I also recall speaking with the then responsible Minister, the Hon. Mark McGowan MLA, in connection with the appointment. However, all I recall about that conversation is that we spoke about how we were both lawyers.
- 11. After I contacted the Department, as described at paragraph 8 above, the Department supplied me with PAYG summaries for financial years ending 30 June 2011 (\$12,722), 30 June 2012 (\$8,682), 30 June 2013 (\$9,046) and 30 June 2014 (\$5,727). The total of those amounts is \$36,177. However, that does not include remuneration for financial years ending 30 June 2006-30 June 2010. I do not know what remuneration I received for those periods and I do not understand why I was given summaries for financial years ending 30 June 2013 and 30 June 2014. I recall that there was sometimes confusion about payments for GWC and the Liquor Commission.
- 12. Meetings of the GWC took about two hours, maybe a little longer. At the time the briefing packs that were supplied were quite small. It would usually take me a couple of hours to read the board packs, plus any time spent refreshing my memory about relevant legislation and the like, if it was needed.

Training

13. I do not recall whether I received any training related to the performance of my functions as a GWC member, generally, or in relation to the regulation and oversight

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of the Perth Casino, specifically. I may have received copies of the relevant legislation, but I cannot be sure.

- 14. While a lawyer at the State Solicitor's Office I had some engagement with the Casino Control Act 1984 and the Gaming and Wagering Commission Act 1987, and so was somewhat familiar with those when I joined the GWC.
- The Chair at the time was Barry Sargeant. If I had questions about my role or the role of the GWC I would ask Barry.
- 16. I was aware that it was appropriate to know the relevant legislation, and I would look at a particular section of an Act, or a regulation, if that happened to be referred to or arose from material in the briefing packs.

Areas of specific responsibility

17. I did not have any specific areas of responsibility on the GWC. Nor, to my recollection, did anyone else. I assume the Chair organised meetings of the GWC and oversaw the preparation of the agenda. There were no sub-committees.

POWERS, DUTIES AND OBLIGATIONS OF THE COMMISSION

Information as to powers, responsibilities, obligations and duties

18. In addition to what I set out at paragraphs 13-16 above, I may have been provided with a copy of the Public Sector Commissioner's guide to being on boards, though it could be that I received that in connection with my membership of the Liquor Commission. I cannot be sure. Otherwise, I don't think that I was provided with any other information about my duties and powers, or the GWC's powers, responsibilities and obligations, when I joined the GWC. As I recall the briefing packs that were provided to me for meetings did not contain any information about my powers, responsibilities, obligations and duties, or those of the GWC.

Obstruction

- 20. To the best of my recollection and during my time on the GWC, the GWC was never obstructed in the exercise of its powers and discharge of its responsibilities and obligations.
- I was never obstructed in the performance of my duties or the exercise of my powers as a member of the GWC.

My understanding of the Commission's policies and procedures, etc

- 22. I remember general discussions amongst members of the GWC about junket operations and money laundering, and that those issues were of general concern to the members of the GWC, but I do not recall any policies or procedures that the GWC had about them.
- 23. I also generally remember conversations about the "cage" at the Perth Casino, but cannot recall any specific policies or procedures in connection with that.
- I do not recall any specific discussion, or policies or procedures, about the risk of criminals infiltrating the Perth Casino.
- 25. GWC may have had interactions with WA police, though I cannot recall any specific details. I have no recollection of any involvement with federal authorities like the Australian Federal Police or the immigration department.
- 26. I don't recall ever seeing a document described as a "Casino Manual".

SUPPORT FROM THE DEPARTMENT

- 27. The Department supported the GWC in the exercise of its functions.
- 28. Departmental staff prepared the briefing packs for members of the GWC.
- 29. I was never dissatisfied with the briefing packs prepared by the Department. The Department was extremely supportive, helpful and useful, including in relation to IT support.
- 30. I do not recall if there were any policies about how the Department would interact with the GWC, or how staff of the Department would report back to the GWC. I know that I could ask questions of Departmental staff in relation to reports and briefing packs, though I do not recall ever doing so.
- 31. I cannot recall who the Chief Casino Officer was at the time, though Michael Connolly was around and I thought he was very competent and intelligent.

CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

- 32. When I joined the GWC I was very aware of conflict of interest situations. I had by that stage been a lawyer for a long time.
- 33. I do not recall if I was provided with a code of conduct either before or after I joined the GWC, or other material about conflicts of interest.

- 34. There may have been a process in place for declaring conflicts of interest at meetings,but I cannot specifically recall it.
- 35. I have no recollection of ever declaring a conflict during my time on the GWC. I don't recall whether any of the other members of the GWC ever declared a conflict while I was on the GWC.
- 36. I do not recall whether GWC or the Department had any policies in place about conflicts of interest for Departmental staff who were assisting the GWC.
