

An \$18 million Aboriginal Short Stay Accommodation facility will be delivered in Geraldton.

What is an Aboriginal Short Stay Accommodation facility and who can use it?

- Safe and affordable short-term accommodation
- Accessible to all Aboriginal people visiting Geraldton
- Referral and access to wrap around services available if needed

How is it funded?

- \$18 million for site acquisition, design, construction and fit-out of the facility
- Funded by the State Government's WA Recovery Plan which aims to support the local economy and community from the impacts of COVID-19

How we design and build

- Extensive consultation with Aboriginal people, the Geraldton community and a range of stakeholders
- Place-based, culturally considered, environmentally sustainable and universal access design
- Apply lessons from the successful design and delivery of existing facilities in Broome, Derby and Kalgoorlie
- Meet the needs of Aboriginal people it will accommodate
- Protect the site's environment and cultural heritage
- Visible connection to the community
- Preference for local contractors to design and construct the facility
- Encourage Aboriginal employment opportunities

What the community told us

Some examples of what we heard are below:

There is overwhelming support for an Aboriginal Short Stay Accommodation facility in Geraldton.

Aboriginal people travel from all areas of the Midwest Gascoyne region to visit Geraldton.

Family groups being accommodated together was seen as being highly important.

Key reasons Aboriginal people visit and stay in Geraldton:

- Health and care (e.g. appointments, giving birth, palliative care, treatment) due to significant lack of these services outside of Geraldton
- Funerals (including people passing through Geraldton for funerals in Perth or Broome)
- Justice / legal reasons

Note: Further stakeholder and community consultation will be undertaken to inform the final design of the facility and placed-based service model.

In July 2021, the Department commissioned an independent consultant agency, Keogh Bay, to find out what the Aboriginal community would like to see at the Geraldton Aboriginal Short Stay Accommodation and how it will look and feel.

- Cultural reasons (e.g. native title discussions, land councils)
- Social reasons (e.g. shopping, visiting friends, sporting events)
- Employment, education and training
- Environmental (e.g. having a break from the remoteness of home)

Must meet the needs of all Aboriginal people visiting Geraldton and be a welcoming place to stay.

Importance should be placed on safety, privacy, ownership, quality, cultural appropriateness, supporting people who have specific needs and responsiveness to the natural environment.

Design approach

The Geraldton Aboriginal Short Stay Accommodation facility will draw from the successful design and delivery of existing facilities in Broome, Derby and Kalgoorlie that have all had a positive impact on the wellbeing of guests who use them.

Stakeholder and community consultation will further inform the design so it is reflective of place and the people who will stay there.


