- For clause 1.43.7(b) – Wholesale Electricity Market Amendment (Tranche 2 and 3 Amendments) Rules 2020.
- For clause 1.43A.6 – Wholesale Electricity Market Amendment (Tranche 5 Amendments) Rules 2021.

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# Submissions and AEMO's Response

The following written submissions were received as part of AEMO's stakeholder consultation.

Relevant Procedure Paragraph(s)	Summary of Submission	AEMO's Response
2.1.1 and 2.1.2	Stakeholder advised paragraphs 2.1.1 and 2.1.2 are almost identical. Suggestion was raised to keep the power to change as one paragraph.	AEMO agrees with this submission and has amended the WEM Procedure.
2.1.2	Stakeholder advised the obligation to publish should be kept separate from the power to change a time.	AEMO agrees with this submission and has amended the WEM Procedure.
3.3.11 and 4.2.6	Stakeholder advised the statement 'a notification within WEMS' may be read that you will only see the notification if you log onto WEMS and read some sort of log. However, if it is intended to be a push notice, then it should be a 'notification via WEMS' to clarify it is a system generated notice.	AEMO's intention is to allow flexibility with AEMO's final system build. There are different options AEMO is considering implementing and the decision is yet to be finalised. AEMO has amended the paragraph to reflect "notification provided through WEMS", so that it can cover a push notification scenario or a notification within the system. Market Participants will always receive a push notification or email notification.
