Section 61

AUTHORISATION BY THE STATE EMERGENCY COORDINATOR

The World Health Organization declared COVID-19 a pandemic on 11 March 2020.

On 15 March 2020, the Minister for Emergency Services declared a state of emergency with effect from 12 am on 16 March 2020 in respect of the pandemic caused by COVID-19 pursuant to section 56 of the *Emergency Management Act 2005* (WA) (Act) (State of Emergency). The State of Emergency applies to the State of Western Australia.

I, Christopher John Dawson, Commissioner of Police and State Emergency Coordinator, pursuant to section 61 of the Act, revoke the authorisation I gave at 1732 hours on 24 September 2021 and now authorise **border officers** to give directions as authorised officers under, pursuant to, or for the purpose of giving effect to the following directions in respect of the State of Emergency:

- (a) the COVID Transition (Border Requirements) Directions; and
- (b) any specified arrangement;

as amended or replaced from time to time.
