The idea of democracy originated from Ancient Greece. The word "democracy" comes from two Greek words: "demos" meaning people and "kratos" meaning rule.

Australia is a democratic country, where Australian citizens aged 18 and over have the responsibility and right to vote for the members of the Local, State and Federal Government.



## Our democracy is protected by the four pillars below



**Constitution:** The Australian Constitution came into effect in 1901 and is a rule book for the Australian Government. It explains how Federal Parliament is set up, and how they make laws.

**Voting:** We have the right to vote for representatives in Federal, State and Territory Parliaments. We can also vote for Local Government.

**Voices:** We have the right to have our voices heard by the Government if we are not happy with certain laws or decisions made. This is known as "Freedom of Speech". We are free within the bounds of the law to say or write what we think as long as it is factual and not harmful.

**Values:** Values are the beliefs and ideas that are important to us. Australia's democracy aims to uphold certain values, such as the ones below.
