COVID TRANSITION (CONSEQUENTIAL REVOCATIONS) DIRECTIONS (No 3)

The World Health Organization declared COVID-19 a pandemic on 11 March 2020.

On 15 March 2020, the Minister for Emergency Services declared a state of emergency with effect from 12 am on 16 March 2020 in respect of the pandemic caused by COVID-19 pursuant to section 56 of the *Emergency Management Act 2005 (WA)* (**Act**). The state of emergency applies to the State of Western Australia.

I, Christopher John Dawson, Commissioner of Police and State Emergency Coordinator, now give the following directions, pursuant to my powers under sections 67, 70 and 72A of the Act.

PREAMBLE

1. The purpose of these directions is to revoke the instruments described in paragraph 4.

CITATION

2. These directions may be referred to as the **COVID Transition (Consequential Revocations) Directions (No 3)**.

COMMENCEMENT

3. These directions come into effect:
 - (a) in relation to the directions referred to in paragraphs 4(a), 4(b) and 4(c), at 12.01 pm on 1 June 2022; and
 - (b) in relation to the instruments referred to in paragraphs 4(d) and 4(e), at 12.01 am on 15 June 2022.


REVOCATION

4. The following instruments are revoked:
 - (a) COVID Transition (International Border) Directions; and
 - (b) Maritime Crew Member Directions (No 10); and
 - (c) Transiting Aircraft Passengers Directions (No 7); and
 - (d) Remote Aboriginal Communities Directions (No 5); and

- (e) each approval, designation or variation made under the Remote Aboriginal Communities Directions (No 5) or made under any of the:
- (i) Remote Aboriginal Communities Directions; or
 - (ii) Remote Aboriginal Communities Directions No. 2; or
 - (iii) Remote Aboriginal Communities Directions No. 3; or
 - (iv) Remote Aboriginal Communities Directions (No 4),
- to the extent remaining in effect at the date and time specified in paragraph 3(b),

(each a **revoked instrument**).

5. Despite paragraph 4, if a person was subject to a requirement under a revoked instrument immediately before the date and time specified in paragraph 3 for that revoked instrument, the person must continue to comply with that requirement to the same extent that the person would if the revoked instrument had not been revoked and, for the avoidance of doubt, if the person fails to comply with a requirement that applied to them under the revoked instrument, the person may commit an offence under the Act.
