

## Environment Online release one - external user acceptance testing feedback summary

Environment Online release one external user acceptance testing (UAT) was conducted in July 2022 where external stakeholders tested scenarios alongside DWER officers to help identify any issues, software bugs, and ensure the end-to-end process meets the requirements of industry stakeholders and our staff. Below is a summary of the feedback received and how it will be addressed and prioritised for inclusion in release one or future releases.

| <b>Authentication</b>  |   |
| 1. Opposition of using My Gov ID as the key authenticator for logging in.  | 1. The use of MyGovID aligns with requirements of the Digital Strategy for the Western Australia Government 2021-2025 and the Australian Government Digital Identity System. It is currently used to provide access to more than 60 State and Commonwealth services/applications. We will be focusing effort on explaining the rationale for the use of MyGovID in upcoming announcements and planned communications. |
| <b>Structure of the project, proposal, and application</b>   |   |
| 1. These are new terms for Part IV assessments and need to be communicated adequately with stakeholders.<br>2. The current structure of creating a project is hidden with the proposal screen. This is not intuitive for the user.<br>3. The application types need to be renamed appropriately (e.g. based on legislation types). | 1. Agreed. We will be engaging stakeholders with these new terms in the coming weeks and after go-live. We hope to offer interactive feature based online sessions with demos after go live.<br>2. Agreed. This will be examined further post go-live and restructured in a future release.<br>3. Fixed. This has now been fixed, with application types reflecting the correct terminology.                          |

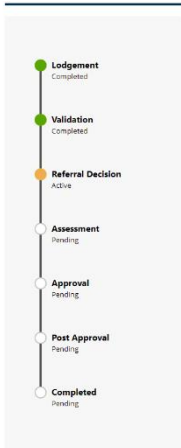

| <b>Spatial data</b>   |  |
| <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Use of the map functionality is clunky, particularly if a user needs to change the shapefiles.</li> <li>2. The map should be able to be expanded, as it currently is too small on the page and therefore not user friendly.</li> <li>3. The draw function on the map appears as a black dot, which cannot be seen against aerial imagery.</li> <li>4. The guide for the map does not work when the map is fully expanded.</li> <li>5. Map symbols not referenced in the legend.</li> <li>6. The map functionality for the alternative location requires an alternative development envelope and disturbance footprint. This needs to be reconsidered.</li> <li>7. The map does not validate the shapefiles if the development envelope and disturbance footprint is the same boundary.</li> <li>8. Following the external UAT, the map functionality has been reworked to ease use of the map functionality. The map functionality will also be looked at further in future releases to improve functionality.</li> <li>2. The map can be expanded using the expansion button in the top right hand of the screen.</li> <li>3. This is currently under investigation to see if the black dot can be changed in colour.</li> <li>4. This has been logged as a bug and will be fixed either pre or post the go-live date.</li> <li>5. Fixed. Map legend is displaying correctly.</li> <li>6. Agreed. It has been decided for Release 1 that the map functionality for alternatives will be switched off and will be reconsidered in future releases.</li> <li>7. Fixed. 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| <b>Matrix (e.g. the elements, activities, aspects and mitigations prefill)</b>   |  |

The reference data for the model elements needs to be cleaned up (multiples of the same element, use of irrelevant numbers in the naming convention, spelling errors).</li> <li>2. Trenching and water supply need to be added as a model element activities.</li> <li>3. Aspects are not populating correctly (e.g. still showing aspects that are related to deleted elements, many irrelevant aspects are displaying so the user needs to delete many irrelevant aspects, and some aspects appear as blank).</li> <li>4. The reference data for mitigations needs to be reviewed (e.g. many mitigations missing).</li> <li>5. 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| <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The fields on the Greenhouse gas emissions page do not recognise commas or decimal places.</li> <li>Would like the ability to upload data in bulk (e.g. the stakeholder and consultation registry, and the alternatives section).</li> <li>The mitigations page could be reworked to include the mitigations hierarchy (avoid, minimise, manage).</li> <li>Wayfinding can be improved (e.g. Confusing to navigate between the Application and the Environmental Review pages, project title banner on the proposal form)</li> <li>Some buttons need to be more obvious than others (e.g. create a project button is inconspicuous).</li> </ol> | <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>This is currently under investigation to ensure that fields can be filled in appropriately.</li> <li>This is currently under investigation as to whether this is possible.</li> <li>It is intended that the mitigation action would indicate the mitigation hierarchy e.g. avoidance area; rehabilitation within 12 months of clearing etc. However, will consider in a future release.</li> <li>Agreed. Work has started on improving wayfinding and will continue in future releases.</li> <li>Agreed. Following the external UAT, considerable work has gone into loading the help text, fixing broken links and ensuring that access to guidance and instructions will work appropriately.</li> <li>Fixed. Acronyms are now appropriately described.</li> <li>Agreed. A knowledgebase article is currently under development to ensure that users understand.</li> </ol>  |

| <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>It would be helpful to be able to edit the referring party details</li> </ol>  | <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Fixed. Referrer details are now editable.</li> </ol>  |

| <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Some of the reference data in table lookups require review (e.g. missing relevant Decision Making Authorities (DMAs))</li> <li>2. The lookup's need to be searching the correct field (e.g. should be able to search position or organisation rather than name)</li> </ol> | <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The reference data is continually being reviewed, expanded and refined. The DMA data has been reviewed for release 1. DMA's that are entered into the system as custom values will be reviewed for input into the reference data.</li> <li>2. Fixed. The position and organisation are now searchable via the DMA lookup.</li> </ol>                                 |

The export functionality is critical to ensure that documents can be appropriately reviewed by proponent and consultants.</li> </ol>   | <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Fixed. The ability to export documents as a pdf and word document was not fully functional during the external UAT, however this has now been fully developed.</li> <li>2. Agreed. The ability to export documents as a pdf and word document has been an integral part of the EO build, as we know that this is critical for proponents and consultants.</li> </ol> |

| <p>1. There is no way to see how much of the form has been filled in until you get to the summary page. This information would be useful throughout the form (e.g. similar to the commonwealth).</p>                         | <p>1. This has been fixed for the Environmental Review Document form, however for the proposal and application forms this will be considered for future releases.</p>  |
| <b>Values</b>  |  |
| <p>1. The lookup for values should have an option to add new values.<br/>2. Matters of National Environmental Significance should be reconfigured to match with the values entered into under each environmental factor.</p> | <p>1. Fixed. There is now an option to add specific values.<br/>2. For consideration in a future release.</p>  |
| <b>Policy and guidance</b>   |  |
| <p>1. It would be useful to have a look up for the relevant policy and guidance field within each Environmental Factor.</p>  | <p>1. For consideration in a future release. Note that the policy and guidance section is not just for inclusion of Environmental Protection Authority policy and guidance. It can also include federal and state policy and guidance.</p> |

| <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. In current state, a proponent will embed many maps and figures throughout a document. For Environment Online, it appears that the figures will need to be attached to the form. How will the figures be accurately referenced in Environment Online?</li> <li>2. Attachments unable to be deleted.</li> <li>3. The attachments page should say the file limit size.</li> <li>4. The ability to drag and drop files would be useful.</li> </ol> | <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The intent is for the proponent to attach the figures to the application, and label them in a way that can be referenced appropriately within the text fields.</li> <li>2. Fixed. Attachments can now be deleted.</li> <li>3. Content on the web page will indicate there is a file size limit of 50MB.</li> <li>4. For consideration in a future release.</li> </ol> |
| <b>Statuses and tasks</b>  |   |
| <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The status of the application from the dashboard is not explained (e.g. what does In Progress mean).</li> <li>2. Tasks do not appear to be functioning correctly (e.g. the application is submitted, however the task still says it is in draft).</li> <li>3. Payment request tasks do not appear to be generating appropriately.</li> </ol>   | <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. An explanation of what each status means will be provided in a Knowledge Article</li> <li>2. Fixed. Tasks have been reviewed and now function appropriately.</li> <li>3. Fixed.
