Collie Jobs and Skills Centre

The WA Government and South Regional TAFE announced the establishment of a new Jobs and Skills Centre in the heart of Collie. This is part of transitioning the Collie workforce towards new jobs.



The Jobs and Skills Centre will be up and running from the TAFE campus by September/October with the aim to have a permanent location in Collie's town centre in early 2023.

The Jobs and Skills Centre will be there for anyone in the community, young and old. It will help connect jobseekers with employment opportunities, provide basic training and will even help with job applications.

South Regional TAFE have also employed four Transition Training Coordinators who will work with employers and coal industry workers to identify skills gaps and training needs for both current and future jobs.

Industry Initiatives

The WA Premier Mark McGowan announced a \$1 million Government contribution to the expansion of the **WesTrac Training Centre** in Collie. By expanding their cutting-edge facility, WesTrac will be able to offer new courses and apprenticeship pathways.





International Graphite announced that installation of pilot scale micronising and spheroidising equipment at its Collie downstream processing facility has been completed. This electrifying announcement is one of the first steps in International Graphite's plan to become a major supplier of graphite for high end batteries.



<u>Smal</u>l grants, Big impacts

The Collie Futures Small Grant Program has allowed small businesses in Collie to grow and expand the local economy.

One initiative has received a grant of \$100,000 towards creating a recreational flying school in Collie.

The grants have also assisted Busy Bee Dry Cleaners to upgrade their laundry equipment.

The Program has helped spark Collabs Scientific Services business case into the viability of establishing scientific services in Collie.
