Emily has worked previously at Troppo Architects and Gary Marinko Architects before starting her practice. Key areas of experience include housing, tourism, and remote aboriginal community

Mt Eyk's projects range in type and scale from small (single room installation) to medium (housing and public). The practice shares a collaborative workspace with other architects, landscape architects, and researchers.

Emily teaches at UWA, currently coordinating first year design studio and master's level practice of architecture units. Emily is a committee member of the Association of Consulting Architects (ACA) where advocacy for proper design process is her key interest.
