Securing a bright future for Collie

In November, the WA Government announced the opening of the \$200 million Collie Industrial Transition Fund, inviting companies to submit an expression of interest to establish operations in Collie. This year, the WA Government has kicked off new efforts to put Collie on the global map, working to attract large-scale industrial projects in targeted sectors to directly support the Collie workforce by securing new, sustainable jobs. These sectors include green manufacturing or minerals processing, clean energy, and energy-intensive industries.

The WA Government is committed to diversifying the Collie economy and bringing long-term job opportunities to the region.

Iconic Replica Coal Mine reopens

The Collie Visitor Centre is thrilled to be welcoming explorers once again, with the underground mine now featuring extensive audio and visual upgrades that provide an enhanced and memorable experience for all ages.

The improved attraction features new, interactive technology showcasing Collie's mining history, replica bell wires, its very



own pit pony, and an explosion simulation with life-like sounds of coal blasting from the coal face. Participants can see the intense labour roles miners endured and kids can use torches to hunt for the replica mice scurrying around the hidden underground spaces.

Supported by the Shire of Collie, Collie Rotary Club, and funding through the Collie Industry Attraction and Development Fund, the WA Government and the Collie Visitor Centre are excited to see the Underground Mine upgrades further highlight the important role that coal mining has played in the region's history.



Game-changing industries shaping Collie's future

Late last year, the WA Government announced Quantum Filtration Medium will receive \$2m to build a new manufacturing facility in Collie, to supercharge production of its in-demand water treatment product.

This follows a \$100,000 Collie Futures Small Grant to Quantum in 2020, which supported the company to establish a research laboratory in Collie. The additional funding for expansion is now expected to almost double Quantum's local workforce.

A further investment of almost \$2 million from the Collie Industry Attraction and Development Fund will support Magnium Australia to move forward with a detailed feasibility stage for its proposed carbon neutral magnesium refinery.

Magnium is working to establish the world's most energy efficient and low emissions magnesium metal refinery in Collie. At full scale, the Magnium refinery could employ up to 350 permanent workers and generate more than 400 jobs in construction.
