

TRADITIONAL KNOWLEDGE CUSTODIAN'

rather than 'Traditional Knowledge Holder'



A CUSTODIAN WILL HAVE THE CULTURAL AUTHORITY to

decide whether, and on what terms, Traditional Knowledge can be shared with others



TRADITIONAL

means knowledge about the genetic resources that has its source in Aboriginal tradition and includes know-how, skills, innovations and practices relating to the genetic resources that have been developed and may continue to evolve in accordance with Aboriginal tradition



DEFINITIONS-

ABORIGINAL TRADITION means

the living, historical and traditional observances, practices, customs, beliefs, values, knowledge and skills of the Aboriginal people of the State, or of a particular group or community of Aboriginal people of the State



TRADITIONAL KNOWLEDGE CUSTODIAN

means an Aboriginal person who individually or collectively with others in accordance with Aboriginal tradition - a) holds Traditional Knowledge, and b) has cultural rights, interests and obligations in respect of the Traditional Knowledge

Inclusion of TRADITIONAL KNOWLEDGE IN THE PUBLIC DOMAIN in the obligations under the Bill


