The Program will offer positions that are regionally based so we want to hear from high-school leavers living in remote and regional areas of WA. Leavers living in the metropolitan area are also encouraged to apply.

Four positions are available for our 2024 intake. In support of our commitment to building an inclusive workforce, one position is dedicated to an applicant who identifies as an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander person, and another for a person with a disability.
