Plan – employment outcomes: January 2022

The Green Jobs Plan is a \$60.3 million investment in environmental projects as part of the WA Recovery Plan managed by four State Government departments, working together. On Monday

27 July 2020, the State Government announced a Green Jobs Plan to help Western Australia's economic recovery from COVID-19. The Green Jobs Plan will create more than 1,000 jobs as part of the WA Recovery Plan.
