



Factsheet CAT09 Categories of child-related work 9: a community child health service



A community **child** health service is a health service provided specifically to children rather than to a range of age groups, that is open to all children in an area/community. This is not to be confused with category 13: a ward of a private or public hospital.

This category includes the following child health service settings:

- Perth Children's Hospital
- child health services
- school health services
- child development services
- child and adolescent mental health services
- mobile health services for at-risk young people.

Roles considered to be in child-related work

Some examples of roles considered to be in <u>child-related work</u> are listed below. Please note that in all cases, for a role to be considered to be in child-related work, the **usual duties** of that role must involve, or be likely to involve, **contact** with a child. Roles include:

- all staff, volunteers, visiting consultants/practitioners who have contact with children as part
 of their usual duties at Perth's Children's hospital
- practitioners and others working at child health service settings where their usual duties include contact with children
- child health nurse
- school health nurse.

Exemptions

The following exemptions apply to this category:

- child volunteers under 18 years of age
- unpaid **students** on placement under 18 years of age
- short-term visitors to WA
