



A transport service specifically for children does not include services that are provided to the general community and are used by children as part of that service.

Roles considered to be in child-related work

Some examples of roles considered to be in [child-related work](#) are listed below. Please note that in all cases, for a role to be considered to be in child-related work, the **usual duties** of that role must involve, or be likely to involve, **contact** with a **child**. Roles include:

- Transperth bus drivers whose usual duties include the provision of bus services specifically for children
- limousine drivers for children's parties, school balls or other services specifically for children
- private coach hire services that service schools for example for school excursions, camps or carnivals
- paid or voluntary persons transporting children to activities, for example transporting children to sporting events.

Exemptions

The following [exemptions](#) apply to this category:

- child **volunteers** – work carried out by volunteers under 18 years of age
- unpaid **students** on placement under 18 years of age
- **short-term visitors** to WA
- a **parent** volunteering on a transport service in which their child is a passenger, or is ordinarily a passenger, refer to [Factsheet CRW03 – Exemptions, the parent volunteer exemption](#)
