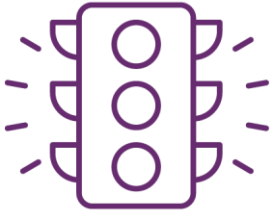

Categories of child-related work 17: a school crossing service



A school crossing service, being a service provided to assist children to cross roads on their way to and from school.

Roles considered to be in child-related work

Some examples of roles considered to be in [child-related work](#) are listed below. Please note that in all cases, for a role to be considered to be in child-related work, the **usual duties** of that role must involve, or be likely to involve, **contact** with a **child**. Roles include:

- a person who volunteers as a school crossing attendant
- 'lollipop' school cross walk attendants (traffic wardens)
- 'walking bus' **volunteer** service.

Exemptions

The following [exemptions](#) apply to this category:

- child volunteers – work carried out by volunteers under 18 years of age
- unpaid **students** on placement under 18 years of age
- **short-term visitors** to WA
- a **parent** volunteering at the school in which their child is enrolled, refer to [Factsheet CRW03 – Exemptions, the parent volunteer exemption](#)
- one-off national events or national tours, refer to [Factsheet CRW02 – Exemptions, one-off national events and national tours](#)
- police officers performing functions as a member of the WA Police.
