



## Factsheet CAT17 Categories of child-related work 17: a school crossing service



A school crossing service, being a service provided to assist children to cross roads on their way to and from school.

## Roles considered to be in child-related work

Some examples of roles considered to be in <u>child-related work</u> are listed below. Please note that in all cases, for a role to be considered to be in child-related work, the **usual duties** of that role must involve, or be likely to involve, **contact** with a **child**. Roles include:

- a person who volunteers as a school crossing attendant
- 'lollipop' school cross walk attendants (traffic wardens)
- 'walking bus' volunteer service.

## **Exemptions**

The following exemptions apply to this category:

- child volunteers work carried out by volunteers under 18 years of age
- unpaid students on placement under 18 years of age
- short-term visitors to WA
- a parent volunteering at the school in which their child is enrolled, refer to <u>Factsheet</u>
  <u>CRW03 Exemptions</u>, the parent volunteer exemption
- one-off national events or national tours, refer to <u>Factsheet CRW02 Exemptions</u>, <u>one-off</u>
  national events and national tours
- police officers performing functions as a member of the WA Police.
