Nine organisations awarded funding to complete **173 dwellings**

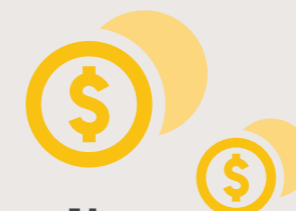
