

**SUPPLY POLICY** 

## **COMMON USE ARRANGEMENTS**

A Common Use Arrangement (CUA) is a whole of government standing offer arrangement for the provision of specific goods or services commonly used within government. CUAs are aggregated supply arrangements that enable a public authority to source goods or services.

Where a CUA has been established, a public authority must purchase under it in accordance with the relevant Buyers' Guide<sup>1</sup>, except where and to the extent that an authorised officer of the Department of Finance, approves alternative arrangements.

## Purchasing from an Australian Disability Enterprise or an Aboriginal Business

Where there is an opportunity to procure from:

- a business that primarily exists to provide the services of persons with a disability and that business is a registered Australian Disability Enterprise<sup>2</sup>; or
- a registered Aboriginal Business<sup>3</sup> and the value of the purchase does not exceed \$250,000<sup>4</sup>;

then a public authority may procure directly from those entities notwithstanding the existence of a mandatory CUA. Approval from the Department of Finance is not required in this instance.
