PROHIBITION ON FISHING (WIRE TRACE) ORDER 2022

Order No.7 of 2022

[2582]

Made by the Minister under section 43.

1. Citation

This order is the *Prohibition on Fishing (Wire Trace) Order 2022*.

2. Interpretation

In this order -

wire trace means a length of steel or metal wire or chain that is attached to, or is part of, a fishing line, but does not include hooks, swivels, or sinkers.

3. Prohibition

A person must not fish in the area described in the Schedule by the use of a wire trace.

Schedule

All Western Australian waters extending 800 metres seaward of the high-water mark on the mainland between 31° 27.314' south latitude and 32° 40.088' south latitude; the waters of the Dawesville Channel up to the Port Bouvard bridge (excluding tributaries); the waters of the Mandurah Estuary up to the Mandurah Estuary Bridge (excluding tributaries); and the waters of the Swan and Canning Rivers (including tributaries).
