Welcome to the Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Inquiry System (ACHIS).


This system provides information about Aboriginal cultural heritage (ACH) in Western Australia.

STEP 1: Open map viewer




STEP 2: Search for Aboriginal cultural heritage






The dropdown menu provides a range of location search options, including by local government, mining tenement or tenure. The following example uses the Street Address option.

STEP 3: Search by Street Address in the search box





STEP 4: Add address details and click search




As you type your road name, the field will autofill and provide a dropdown list of options. With your road name selected, the town/locality/suburb field will default to a range of suburb options for that address.

Click Search

Read the disclaimer and select Continue.



STEP 5: Aboriginal cultural heritage will appear on the left (if present on the property)



If Aboriginal cultural heritage is located on the property, it will appear as a pink hatched area with its official identification number (see above). Click on this area to generate the ACH Registered Sites Report which includes contact details, where available, of the relevant knowledge holders.

To download a report, select and then select Search Results Report and Map. Save the pdf. to your computer.

Note that to preserve confidentiality, the exact location and extent of some places are not displayed on the map—however a shaded region (generally with an area of at least 4km²) provides a general indication of where the place is located.

Please contact the Department for clarification on the exact location in these instances.
