Offences and penalties

Employees, volunteers, students and self-employed

There are a range of penalties for not complying with the [Working with Children \(Screening\) Act 2004](#) (the Act). This Factsheet provides a summary of the offences and penalties that apply to employees, **volunteers**, **students**, and self-employed people engaged in [child-related work](#). For the exact wording of offences please refer to the Act.

It is an offence to:	Penalty and reference
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> engage in child-related work without a current Working with Children (WWC) Card or pending application. 	A fine of \$60,000 and imprisonment for 5 years. Section 24.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> fail to apply for a WWC Card within 10 days of receiving a written notice from the WWC Screening Unit instructing you to do so. 	A fine of \$1,000 Sections 16(5) and 17(4).
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> engage in child-related work if you have a current Interim Negative Notice or Negative Notice. 	A fine of \$60,000 and imprisonment for 5 years. Section 23.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> access the child volunteer exemptions or parent volunteer exemption if you have a current Negative Notice or Interim Negative Notice. 	A fine of \$60,000 and imprisonment for 5 years. Section 23.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> engage in child-related work if: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> you have a current WWC card, but have not been engaged in child-related work and there has been a relevant change in your criminal record since the WWC Card was issued without re-applying for a new WWC Card. 	A fine of \$60,000 and imprisonment for 5 years. Section 31(2).
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> engage in child-related work if you have been charged with or convicted of a Class 1 offence, committed, or allegedly committed as an adult. 	A fine of \$60,000 and imprisonment for 5 years. Section 33.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • fail to provide written notice to the WWC Screening Unit of a relevant change in your criminal record as soon as practical after the change occurs. <p>Applies if you:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ have a current WWC Card ○ have a current WWC Card but are not currently engaged in child-related work ○ have a pending application for a WWC Check or ○ have a pending application for the cancellation of your Negative Notice. 	<p>A fine of \$60,000 and imprisonment for 5 years.</p> <p>Sections 28(2), 29(1), 30 and 31(4).</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • fail to provide written notice to your employer/volunteer organisation/education provider of a relevant change in your criminal record as soon as practical after the change occurs <p>Applies if you:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ are a WWC Card holder or ○ have a pending application for a WWC Card <p>Does not apply if you are self-employed.</p>	<p>A fine of \$60,000 and imprisonment for 5 years.</p> <p>Section 29(1) and 32A.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • fail to provide written notice to your employer/volunteer organisation/education provider of a relevant change in your criminal record as soon as practical after the change occurs and that you have re-applied for a WWC Card. <p>Applies if you:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ have a current WWC Card but have not been engaged in child-related work ○ have had a relevant change in your criminal record since your WWC Card was issued ○ wish to re-engage in child-related work and ○ have re-applied for a new WWC Card. 	<p>A fine of \$60,000 and imprisonment for 5 years.</p> <p>Section 31(3).</p>

It is an offence to:	Penalty and reference
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> fail to comply with the instructions of an Authorised Officer. 	<p>A fine of \$12,000 and imprisonment for 12 months. Section 34Q.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> interfere or deal with any thing that has been seized by an Authorised Officer. 	<p>A fine of \$12,000 and imprisonment for 12 months. Section 34T(5).</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> give information that is false or misleading to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> your current or proposed employer/volunteer organisation (who is engaging who in child-related work) your education provider the WWC Screening Unit or an Authorised Officer. 	<p>A fine of \$24,000 and imprisonment for 2 years. Section 35.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> obstruct or hinder an Authorised Officer. 	<p>A fine of \$12,000 and imprisonment for 12 months. Section 35A.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> impersonate an Authorised Officer. 	<p>A fine of \$120,000 and imprisonment for 12 months. Section 35B.</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> fail to notify the WWC Screening Unit of a change in particulars as soon as practical after the change occurs (refer to Factsheet APP02: Change in particulars, updating of details). <p>Applies if you:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> have a current WWC Card have a pending application for a WWC Card have a pending application for the cancellation of your Negative Notice are aware that you are subject to a reassessment or are subject to any circumstances prescribed by the Working with Children (Screening) Regulations 2005. 	<p>A fine of \$5,000. Section 35C(2).</p>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • fail to return your WWC Card as soon as practical after: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ you have been charged or convicted of a Class 1 offence, committed, or allegedly committed as an adult ○ you have been issued with a Negative Notice or Interim Negative Notice or ○ your WWC Card has been cancelled. 	<p>A fine of \$12,000 and imprisonment for 12 months. Section 36.</p>
