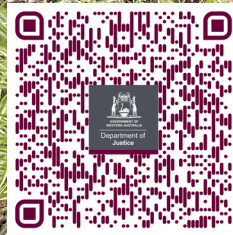
Graduate Officers are provided with career counselling and support from a formal mentor, the Graduate Coordinators and their line managers.
