Collie murals win big with national awards

Collie's artistic landmarks have gained new national attention after being recognised as the best in the country for art-loving visitors at the Australian Street Art Awards.

The Collie Mural Trail experience won gold in the national Best Street Art Trial category, putting Collie on the map for its must-see attractions that highlight the town's rich artistic heritage, history, and cultural significance. The town's iconic Wellington Dam Mural 'Reflections' by Guido Van Helten was also named Best Street Art Experience in Western Australia and was announced as runner up in the national Best Mega Mural category.

Boasting more than 40 murals, Collie's expansive outdoor art gallery formed part of the WA Government's \$1.5 million trail project developed to grow local tourism and has quickly become one of the South-West's most popular and recognisable art attractions.











10-year roadmap to Collie's growing tourism economy

The roadmap toward Collie's strong future as a growing tourism destination was recognised at the recent Tourism WA's South-West Regional Roadshow, with Tourism representatives from the Shire of Collie and local travel operators among those that attended.

The roadshow provided Collie representatives an insight into the WA Government's tourism strategy, outlining the recently launched 10-year plan to elevate the South West's visitor economy.

In collaboration with Tourism WA, opportunities for Collie were workshopped with a focus on developing key initiatives that build on local accommodation and attractions and increase Collie's growing reputation as a world-class adventure destination.

Milestone moment for Collie's Big Battery

Construction is now underway on Synergy's Collie battery energy storage system, bringing Collie one step closer to being home to one of the biggest grid-scale batteries in Australia.

Offering new levels of security to Western Australia's main power system once complete, the Collie Battery is expected to provide around 500 megawatts or 2,000 megawatt hours of power when fully charged. Considered one of WA's most significant renewable energy infrastructure projects, the battery will help improve the security of WA's energy system and support increased renewable energy generation.

Expected to be completed by the end of 2025, Synergy has awarded local earthworks and rehabilitation specialists Cardinal Contractors to complete site preparation and earthworks for the project, which is expected to create 500 local jobs during the construction phases.

With the battery expected to provide long-term system stability and support the uptake of more renewables, the project forms part of the WA Government's wider decarbonisation efforts and contributes to WA's strong and sustainable renewable future.
