

Standard Proof of Identity Documents

When completing your NDIS Worker Screening Check application, appropriate identification documents must be provided for your application to be processed.

- Applicants must supply a total of four identity documents from the three categories below. A document can only be used once, across the three categories.
- The combination of identity documents must contain the applicants full name, date of birth and a photograph.
- If identity documents are in a former name, such as a maiden name, the applicant must provide evidence of the name change (such as change of name certificate issued by the Australian Registry of Births, Deaths and Marriages) in addition to the four documents.

Commencement of Identity Document	 Valid Australian Visa current at time of entry to Australia as resident or tourist (supported by a foreign passport)
(provide one)	 ImmiCard issued by the Department of Home Affairs
	Australian Citizenship Certificate

	For persons aged under 18 with no other Primary Use in Community Documents, a current student identification card with photo or signature.
CATEGORY TWO: Primary Use in Community Document (provide one)	 Current Proof of Age or photo identity card issued by an Australian Commonwealth government agency in your name with photo and signature
	 Current passport issued by a country other than Australia with a valid visa or valid entry stamp or equivalent
	Current Australian Passport
	 Current Australian Driver's Licence, Learner permit or Provisional Licence issued by a State or Territory, showing signature and/or photo

	• Certified academic transcript from an Australian university or a registered higher education provider
	Trusted referees report
	 Bank card, credit card (without recording the payment card number/s)
	• Australian Tax Office tax file number letter or tax notice of assessment letter
	• Firearm Licence
	 Australian secondary or tertiary student photo card

You may need to renew or obtain relevant documentation to meet the identity requirements.
