ELECTRICITY SYSTEM AND MARKET RULES

Market Rules made by the Minister for Energy.

I, Amber-Jade Sanderson, Minister for Energy for the State of Western Australia hereby give notice of market rules made in accordance with regulation 7(5) of the *Electricity Industry (Electricity System and Market) Regulations 2004.*

These market rules may be cited as the *Electricity System and Market Amendment (Tranche 8) Rules 2025* and are to commence—

- The amending rules set out in Schedule 1 come into operation at 8:00 AM (WST) on the day after the day of publication of this notice in the *Gazette*.
- 2. The amending rules set out in Schedule 2 come into operation at 8:00 AM (WST) on the day after the day of publication of this notice in the *Gazette*.
- 3. The amending rules set out in Schedule 3 come into operation immediately after the commencement of the amending rules in Schedule 2 of the *Wholesale Electricity Market Amendment (RCM Reviews Sequencing) Rules* 2025, that commence at 8:00 AM (WST) on 1 January 2026.
- 4. The amending rules set out in Schedule 4 come into operation immediately after the commencement of the amending rules in Schedule 3 of the *Wholesale Electricity Market Amendment (RCM Reviews Sequencing) Rules* 2025, that commence at 8:00 AM (WST) on 1 October 2026.
- 5. The amending rules set out in Schedule 5 come into operation immediately after the commencement of the amending rules in Schedule 4 of the Wholesale Electricity Market Amendment (RCM Reviews Sequencing) Rules 2025, that commence at 8:00 AM (WST) on 1 October 2027.
- 6. The amending rules set out in Schedule 6 come into operation immediately after the commencement of the amending rules in Schedule 5 of the Wholesale Electricity Market Amendment (RCM Reviews Sequencing) Rules 2025.
- 7. The amending rules set out in Schedule 7 come into operation at a time specified by the Minister in a notice published in the *Gazette*. Different days may be specified for different provisions.
- 8. The amending rules set out in Schedule 8 come into operation immediately after the commencement of the amending rules in Schedule 2 of the Wholesale Electricity Market Amendment (Supplementary Capacity No. 3) Rules 2024.
- 9. The amending rules set out in Schedule 9 come into operation at a time specified by the Minister in a notice published in the *Gazette*. Different days may be specified for different provisions.

 - (ii) a caravan park;
 - (iii) hosted short-term rental accommodation;
 - (iv) a lodging-house as defined in the *Health* (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1911 section 3(1);
 - (v) a park home park;
 - (vi) a retirement village as defined in the *Retirement Villages Act 1992* section 3(1);
 - (vii) a road house:
 - (viii) workforce accommodation;
