

Murujuga Rock Art Stakeholder Reference Group
Summary of meeting held 11 October 2024
(WA Museum Boola Bardip, Perth Cultural Centre)

The Murujuga Rock Art Stakeholder Reference Group (SRG) members and observers attended the Q3 2024 meeting, which was held at WA Museum Boola Bardip.

The Murujuga Aboriginal Corporation (MAC) announced that Murujuga Rock Art Monitoring Program (MRAMP) Ranger Glen Aubrey recently secured a promotion to Senior Ranger. Both MRAMP Rangers have made progress in the micro-credential units and have completed theory assessments for the Introduction to Workplace Health and Safety unit. The practical assessment is scheduled for early November.

Department of Water and Environmental Regulation (DWER) provided an update on the independent peer review process and sought feedback on the scope of the 5-year review of the Murujuga Rock Art Strategy, commencing in 2025.

Curtin University presented an update on the commissioning and installation of the Light Detection and Ranging (LiDAR) campaign that involves LiDARs from University of Melbourne, University of Newcastle and DWER.

The MRAMP team provided an update on additional studies to be undertaken for the monitoring program, including rock sample collections from the Rio Tinto railway cutting south of the Dampier townsite. This work required approval from Murujuga Elders.
