Simcoa thanks Energy Policy WA for the opportunity to provide feedback on the Exposure Draft of Electricity System and Market (ESM) Amending Rules (Tranche 9) and the subsequent amendments.

We offer the following comments for your consideration;

Tranche 9 Addendum

- Demand Side Programmes
 - The Addendum proposes to allow Market Participants to nominate up to 20 days in a Capacity Year for exclusion from the calculation of the dynamic baseline, subject to notifying AEMO no later than one Business Day after the day to be excluded. We agree this approach is a constructive step toward resolving the issue. However, we consider the one-day notification period to be somewhat restrictive. While we understand the intent to minimise administrative burden on AEMO, particularly where numerous NDLs are involved, we recommend extending the notification period to three Business Days. This would provide Market Participants with a more practical timeframe to manage such requests.
- 2. Non-Temperature Dependent Load (NTDL)
 The Addendum proposes to bring forward the policy decision from the Reserve Capacity
 Mechanism Review to remove the concept of a Non-Temperature Dependent Load (NTDL)
 so as to remove the current situation where the NTDL ratio is higher than the TDL ratio.
 Whilst this would provide some short-term benefit to NTDL loads, it may not do so over the
 whole period prior to 1 October 2027. In this instance therefore, we suggest that the
 proposed changes are not brought forward. We do acknowledge the consideration that has
 been given to the current issue.
