Priority Projects

Priority Projects are development projects designated by the Minister for State Development as being economically or strategically significant to the State.

Benefits of Priority Projects

- Fast tracked approvals
- Reduced duplication of process
- Strategic recognition
- Coordinated engagement and support across government

Types of Priority Project developments

A Priority Project may be any development project that is economically or strategically significant to the State because it delivers:

- Critical or common user infrastructure
- Strong capital investment
- Job-creating employment opportunities
- Broader economic or social benefits

Additional guidance materials will be released to support implementation of the Act



Priority Project designation

Priority Projects are designated by the Minister for State Development with approval from the Premier, based on recommendations from the Coordinator General (CG).

The CG works across government, including through the Lead Agency Framework, to identify, investigate and assess potential projects before making recommendations for designation.

Once designated, the Office of the CG oversees delivery by using powers under the Act to coordinate and facilitate government approvals and assessment processes. Projects are typically supported until they reach a Final Investment Decision.
