



WA's weekly fuel update

Summary of current situation:

What we have achieved this week:

- With the Albanese Government and other States and Territories, **we delivered a cut to the fuel excise that will save motorists 32 cents a litre.**
- That means **less money on fuel, and more money back in the wallets of motorists.**
- Adopted the **National Fuel Security Plan at National Cabinet** and are working together to keep Australia moving.
- At Level 2 of the national plan, we put emergency powers in place to compel fuel companies to give us critical information to get fuel to where it's needed most.
- Our Fuel Industry Operations Group continues to meet – **government and industry working together to identify priority sectors and locations.**
- The **State Fuel Security Controller continues to work directly with fuel companies and distributors** with a focus on getting supply out to our regions.
- Additional fuel is flowing into the system, **including up to 5 million litres from Atlas Fuels directed to the Wheatbelt and other key regions.**
- FuelWatch data is helping us identify pressure points over Easter so we can direct real-time top-ups. **More than 5 million visits were made to Fuelwatch in March.**

What we are working to address:

- With the new information from fuel companies – we can get fuel where it's needed most.
- We will monitor the effectiveness of the new information and make changes to the emergency orders if needed.
